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### AN ACT

To repeal sections 301.020, 301.064, 301.080, as enacted by senate bill no. 3, eighty-eighth general assembly, first regular session, 301.064 as enacted by house bill no. 769, eighty-ninth general assembly, first regular session, 301.129, 301.131, 301.132, 301.142, 301.144 as enacted by senate bill no. 3, eighty-eighth general assembly, first regular session, 301.144 as enacted by senate bill no. 70, eighty-eighth general assembly, first regular session, 301.145, 301.192, 301.215, 301.300, 301.340, 301.370, 301.441, 301.443, 301.444, 301.445, 301.447, 301.448, 301.449, 301.451, 301.453, 301.454, 301.456, 301.457, 301.458, 301.459, 301.461, 301.462, 301.463, 301.464, 301.465, 301.466, 301.564, 301.711, and 301.800, RSMo 2000, relating to motor vehicle license plates, and to enact in lieu thereof forty new sections relating to the same subject with a penalty provision.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Sections 301.020, 301.064, 301.080, as enacted by senate bill no. 3, eighty-  
2 eighth general assembly, first regular session, 301.064 as enacted by house bill no. 769, eighty-  
3 ninth general assembly, first regular session, 301.129, 301.131, 301.132, 301.142, 301.144 as  
4 enacted by senate bill no. 3, eighty-eighth general assembly, first regular session, 301.144 as  
5 enacted by senate bill no. 70, eighty-eighth general assembly, first regular session, 301.145,  
6 301.192, 301.215, 301.300, 301.340, 301.370, 301.441, 301.443, 301.444, 301.445, 301.447,  
7 301.448, 301.449, 301.451, 301.453, 301.454, 301.456, 301.457, 301.458, 301.459, 301.461,  
8 301.462, 301.463, 301.464, 301.465, 301.466, 301.564, 301.711, and 301.800, RSMo 2000, are  
9 repealed and forty new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 301.020,

14 as follows:

301.020. 1. Every owner of a motor vehicle or trailer, which shall be operated or driven  
2 upon the highways of this state, except as herein otherwise expressly provided, shall annually  
3 file, by mail or otherwise, in the office of the director of revenue, an application for registration  
4 on a blank to be furnished by the director of revenue for that purpose containing:

5 (1) A brief description of the motor vehicle or trailer to be registered, including the name  
6 of the manufacturer, the vehicle identification number, the amount of motive power of the motor  
7 vehicle, stated in figures of horsepower and whether the motor vehicle is to be registered as a  
8 motor vehicle primarily for business use as defined in section 301.010;

9 (2) The name, the applicant's identification number and address of the owner of such  
10 motor vehicle or trailer;

11 (3) The gross weight of the vehicle and the desired load in pounds if the vehicle is a  
12 commercial motor vehicle or trailer.

13 2. If the vehicle is a motor vehicle primarily for business use as defined in section  
14 301.010 and if such vehicle is five years of age or less, the director of revenue shall retain the  
15 odometer information provided in the vehicle inspection report, and provide for prompt access  
16 to such information, together with the vehicle identification number for the motor vehicle to  
17 which such information pertains, for a period of five years after the receipt of such information.  
18 This section shall not apply unless:

19 (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of ownership was submitted after July 1,  
20 1989; and

21 (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a manufacturer's statement of origin.

22 3. If the vehicle is any motor vehicle other than a motor vehicle primarily for business  
23 use, a recreational motor vehicle, motorcycle, motortricycle, bus or any commercial motor  
24 vehicle licensed for over twelve thousand pounds and if such motor vehicle is five years of age  
25 or less, the director of revenue shall retain the odometer information provided in the vehicle  
26 inspection report, and provide for prompt access to such information, together with the vehicle  
27 identification number for the motor vehicle to which such information pertains, for a period of  
28 five years after the receipt of such information. This subsection shall not apply unless:

29 (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of ownership was submitted after July 1,  
30 1990; and

31 (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a manufacturer's statement of origin.

32           4. If the vehicle qualifies as a reconstructed motor vehicle, motor change vehicle,  
33 specially constructed motor vehicle, non-USA-std motor vehicle, as defined in section 301.010,  
34 the owner or lienholder shall surrender the certificate of ownership. The owner shall make an  
35 application for a new certificate of ownership, pay the required title fee, and obtain the vehicle  
36 examination certificate required pursuant to section 301.190. [Notarized] Bills of sale along with  
37 a copy of the front and back of the certificate of ownership for all major component parts  
38 installed on the vehicle and invoices for all essential parts which are not defined as major  
39 component parts shall accompany the application for a new certificate of ownership. If the  
40 vehicle is a specially constructed motor vehicle, as defined in section 301.010, two pictures of  
41 the vehicle shall be submitted with the application. If the vehicle is a kit vehicle, the applicant  
42 shall submit the invoice and the manufacturer's statement of origin on the kit. If the vehicle  
43 requires the issuance of a special number by the director of revenue or a replacement vehicle  
44 identification number, the applicant shall submit the required application and application fee.  
45 All applications required [under] **pursuant to** this subsection shall be submitted with any  
46 applicable taxes which may be due on the purchase of the vehicle or parts. The director of  
47 revenue shall appropriately designate "Reconstructed Motor Vehicle", "Motor Change Vehicle",  
48 "Non-USA-Std Motor Vehicle", or "Specially Constructed Motor Vehicle" on the current and  
49 all subsequent issues of the certificate of ownership of such vehicle.

50           5. Every insurance company which pays a claim for repair of a motor vehicle which as  
51 the result of such repairs becomes a reconstructed motor vehicle as defined in section 301.010  
52 shall in writing notify the claimant, if [he] **such person** he is the owner of the vehicle, and the  
53 lienholder if a lien is in effect, that [he] **such person** is required to surrender the certificate of  
54 ownership, and the documents and fees required pursuant to subsection 3 of this section, to the  
55 director of revenue. The insurance company shall within thirty days of the payment of such  
56 claims report to the director of revenue the name and address of such claimant, the year, make,  
57 model, vehicle identification number, and license plate number of the vehicle, and the date of  
58 loss and payment.

59           6. Anyone who fails to comply with the requirements of this section shall be guilty of  
60 a class B misdemeanor.

61           7. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to promote a  
62 blindness education, screening and treatment program. The director of revenue shall collect the  
63 donations and deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of the blindness  
64 education, screening and treatment program fund established in section 192.935, RSMo. Moneys  
65 in the blindness education, screening and treatment program fund shall be used solely for the  
66 purposes established in section 192.935, RSMo, except that the department of revenue shall  
67 retain no more than one percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this

68 subsection is voluntary and may be refused by the applicant for registration at the time of  
69 issuance or renewal. The director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the applicant  
70 presents the completed application to the director whether the applicant is interested in making  
71 the one-dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

[301.064. 1. The annual registration fee for a land improvement contractors'  
2 commercial motor vehicle is three hundred and fifty dollars. The maximum gross  
3 weight for which such a vehicle may be registered is seventy-three thousand two  
4 hundred and eighty pounds. Transporting for hire by such a motor vehicle is  
5 prohibited.

6 2. Upon application to the director of revenue accompanied by an affidavit  
7 signed by the owner or owners stating that the motor vehicle to be licensed as a land  
8 improvement contractors' commercial motor vehicle shall not be operated in any  
9 manner other than as prescribed in section 301.010, and by the amount of the  
10 registration fee prescribed in subsection 1 of this section, and otherwise complying  
11 with the laws relating to the registration and licensing of motor vehicles, the owner  
12 or owners shall be issued a distinctive set of land improvement contractors' license  
13 plates. The director of revenue shall by regulation determine the characteristic  
14 features of land improvement contractors' license plates so that they may be readily  
15 identified as such.]

301.064. 1. The annual registration fee for a land improvement contractors' commercial  
2 motor vehicle is three hundred and fifty dollars. The maximum gross weight for which such a  
3 vehicle may be registered is eighty thousand pounds. Transporting for hire by such a motor  
4 vehicle is prohibited.

5 2. Upon application to the director of revenue accompanied by [an affidavit] **a statement**  
6 signed by the owner or owners stating that the motor vehicle to be licensed as a land  
7 improvement contractors' commercial motor vehicle shall not be operated in any manner other  
8 than as prescribed in section 301.010, and by the amount of the registration fee prescribed  
9 [above] **in subsection 1 of this section**, and otherwise complying with the laws relating to the  
10 registration and licensing of motor vehicles, the owner or owners shall be issued a set of land  
11 improvement contractors' license plates. The advisory committee established in section 301.129  
12 shall determine the characteristic features of land improvement contractors' license plates so that  
13 they may be readily identified as such, except that such license plates shall be made with fully  
14 reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and  
15 shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. [Any rule or portion of a rule  
16 promulgated pursuant to sections 301.010, 301.057, 301.058, and 301.064 may be suspended by  
17 the committee on administrative rules until such time as the general assembly may by concurrent  
18 resolution reinstate such rule.] **Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section**  
19 **536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in sections 301.010 to 301.064**  
20 **shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of**

21 **chapter 536, RSMo. All rulemaking authority delegated prior to August 28, 2001, is of no**  
22 **force and effect and repealed. Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to repeal or affect**  
23 **the validity of any rule filed or adopted prior to the effective date of this section if it fully**  
24 **complied with the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo,**  
25 **are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to**  
26 **chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date or to disapprove and annul a rule**  
27 **are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any**  
28 **rule proposed or adopted after the effective date of this section shall be invalid and void.**

301.080. 1. Upon application for registration of a motor vehicle, other than a  
2 commercial motor vehicle, by an owner who holds license plates in a registration period which  
3 has expired, the director shall register said vehicle for the fraction of the twelve-month period  
4 as will enable the owner to use the license plates so held [by him], and [he] **the owner** shall be  
5 required to pay a fee computed on the basis of one-twelfth of the full year's registration fee  
6 prescribed for such vehicles, multiplied by the number of months remaining in the registration  
7 period for which [he] **the owner** shall be required to register. When the registration renewal is  
8 subject to the delinquent renewal penalty imposed by section 301.050, the owner shall file [an  
9 affidavit] **a statement** of nonoperation for the months during which the license plates were  
10 expired or pay the full twelve-month registration fee.

11 2. For new vehicles, other than commercial motor vehicles, not previously registered in  
12 this state, the fee shall be computed on the basis of one-twelfth of the full year's registration fee  
13 prescribed for such vehicles, multiplied by the number of months of the current registration year  
14 which have not fully expired on the date of application. When ownership of a nonregistered  
15 vehicle, other than a commercial motor vehicle, which has not been previously operated on the  
16 public highways during the current registration year, is transferred, the registration fee to be paid  
17 by transferee shall be computed as provided above for new vehicles, providing a satisfactory  
18 [affidavit] **statement** of such nonoperation is filed with the department of revenue. In the case  
19 of a new vehicle, a vehicle not previously registered in Missouri, or a vehicle which is  
20 transferred, the legal date of application for registration shall be the date on which such vehicle  
21 was first operated on the public highways after it was acquired by the applicant; provided,  
22 however, if the bill of sale is dated prior to the date the vehicle was placed in operation, the  
23 applicant must file [an affidavit] **a statement** of nonoperation, provided the later date is  
24 fractional in the computation of the registration fee.

301.129. [There is established in this section an advisory committee for the department  
2 of revenue, which shall exist solely to develop uniform designs and common colors for motor  
3 vehicle license plates issued under this chapter and to determine appropriate license plate  
4 parameters for all license plates issued under this chapter. The advisory committee may adopt

5 more than one type of design and color scheme for license plates issued under this chapter;  
6 however, each license plate of a distinct type shall be uniform in design and color scheme with  
7 all other license plates of that distinct type. The specifications for the fully reflective material  
8 used for the plates, as required by section 301.130, shall be determined by the committee. Such  
9 plates shall meet any specific requirements prescribed in this chapter. The advisory committee  
10 shall consist of the director of revenue, the superintendent of the highway patrol, the correctional  
11 enterprises administrator, one person appointed by the governor, one state senator appointed by  
12 the president pro tem of the senate and one state representative appointed by the speaker of the  
13 house of representatives. Prior to April 1, 1996, the committee shall meet, select a chairman from  
14 among their members, and develop uniform design and license plate parameters for the motor  
15 vehicle license plates issued under this chapter. Prior to determining the final design of the  
16 plates, the committee shall hold at least three public meetings in different areas of the state to  
17 invite public input on the final design. Members of the committee shall be reimbursed for their  
18 actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties under this section out  
19 of funds appropriated for that purpose. The committee shall direct the director of revenue to  
20 implement its final design of the uniform motor vehicle license plates and any specific  
21 parameters for all license plates developed by the committee not later than April 1, 1996. The  
22 committee shall be dissolved upon completion of its duties under this section.] **1. There is**  
23 **hereby established an advisory committee for the department of revenue, which shall exist**  
24 **to develop guidelines for the issuance of specialized motor vehicle plates pursuant to this**  
25 **chapter. The advisory committee shall adopt guidelines to be used by the director of**  
26 **revenue, which shall include the following:**

27       **(1) The types of public or private entities, organizations or societies which shall be**  
28 **allowed to have their emblem or other symbol on a license plate;**

29       **(2) The type of design allowable for, and the general specifications of, an emblem**  
30 **or other symbol on a license plate. The allowable design and specifications of any emblem**  
31 **or symbol shall not unduly conflict with the overall uniformity of the design or color of, or**  
32 **the materials used in, standard license plates;**

33       **(3) Recommendations as to the number of specialized license plates that should be**  
34 **requested before such plates are issued; and**

35       **(4) Recommendations as to the total number of license plates that should be issued**  
36 **containing any specific emblem or other symbol of a public or private entity, organization**  
37 **or society.**

38       **2. The advisory committee shall consist of the following:**

39       **(1) The director of the department of revenue or the director's designee;**

40       **(2) The director of the department of public safety or director's designee;**

- 41           **(3) The director of the department of corrections or director's designee;**  
42           **(4) One person appointed by the governor;**  
43           **(5) One state senator appointed by the president pro tem of the senate; and**  
44           **(6) One state representative appointed by the speaker of the house of**  
45 **representatives.**

46           **3. Before November 1, 2001, the committee shall meet and select a chairman from**  
47 **among its members. Before determining the guidelines, the committee shall hold at least**  
48 **three public meetings in different areas of the state to invite public input on the final**  
49 **design. Members of the committee shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary**  
50 **expenses incurred in the performance of their duties pursuant to this section out of funds**  
51 **appropriated for that purpose. The committee may use the services of the employees and**  
52 **staff of the department of revenue subject to the approval of the director of the department**  
53 **of revenue. The committee shall direct the director of revenue to implement its guidelines**  
54 **for all specialized license plates not later than July 1, 2002.**

301.131. 1. Any motor vehicle over twenty-five years old which is owned solely as a  
2 collector's item and which is used and intended to be used for exhibition and educational  
3 purposes shall be permanently registered upon payment of a registration fee of twenty-five  
4 dollars. Upon the transfer of the title to any such vehicle the registration shall be canceled and  
5 the license plates issued therefor shall be returned to the director of revenue.

6           2. The owner of any such vehicle shall file an application in a form prescribed by the  
7 director, if such vehicle meets the requirements of this section, and a certificate of registration  
8 shall be issued therefor. Such certificate need not specify the horsepower of the motor vehicle.

9           3. The director shall issue to the owner of any motor vehicle registered pursuant to this  
10 section the same number of license plates which would be issued with a regular annual  
11 registration, containing the number assigned to the registration certificate issued by the director  
12 of revenue. Such license plates shall be kept securely attached to the motor vehicle registered  
13 hereunder. [The advisory committee established in section 301.129 shall determine the  
14 characteristic features of such license plates for vehicles registered pursuant to the provisions of  
15 this section so that they may be recognized as such, except that] Such license plates shall be  
16 made with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly  
17 visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.

18           4. Historic vehicles may be driven to and from repair facilities one hundred miles from  
19 the vehicle's location, and in addition may be driven up to one thousand miles per year for  
20 personal use. The owner of the historic vehicle shall be responsible for keeping a log of the  
21 miles driven for personal use each calendar year. Such log must be kept in the historic vehicle  
22 when the vehicle is driven on any state road. The historic vehicle's mileage driven in an antique

23 auto tour or event and mileage driven to and from such a tour or event shall not be considered  
24 mileage driven for the purpose of the mileage limitations in this section. Violation of this section  
25 is a class C misdemeanor and in addition to any other penalties prescribed by law, upon  
26 conviction thereof, the director of revenue shall revoke the historic motor vehicle license plates  
27 of such violator which were issued pursuant to this section.

28         5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this section to the contrary, any person possessing  
29 a license plate issued by the state of Missouri [prior to 1979] **that is over twenty-five years old,**  
30 in which the year of the issuance of such plate is consistent with the year of the manufacture of  
31 the vehicle, the owner of the vehicle may register such plate as [a personalized plate by following  
32 the procedures for personalized license plate registration and paying the same fees as prescribed  
33 in section 301.144] **an historic vehicle plate as set forth in subsections 1 and 2 of this section,**  
34 **provided that the configuration of letters, numbers or combination of letters and numbers**  
35 **of such plate are not identical to the configuration of letters, numbers or combination of**  
36 **letters and numbers of any plates already issued to an owner by the director.** Such license  
37 plate shall not be required to possess the characteristic features of reflective material and  
38 common color scheme and design as prescribed in section 301.130. **The owner of the historic**  
39 **vehicle registered pursuant to this subsection shall keep the certificate of registration in the**  
40 **vehicle at all times. The certificate of registration shall be prima facie evidence that the**  
41 **vehicle has been properly registered with the director and that all fees have been paid.**

301.132. 1. Any motor vehicle manufactured in 1948 or before which is modified for  
2 safe road use, including but not limited to modifications to the drive train, suspension, brake  
3 system, and any safety or comfort apparatus and which is not owned solely as a collector's item  
4 and which is not used or intended to be used solely for exhibition and educational purposes only,  
5 may be specially registered as a "street rod" upon payment of an annual fee equal to the fee  
6 charged for personalized license plates in section 301.144 in addition to the regular annual  
7 registration fees. Upon the transfer of the title to any such vehicle the registration shall be  
8 canceled and the license plates issued therefor shall be returned to the director of revenue.

9         2. The owner of any such vehicle shall file an application in a form prescribed by the  
10 director[, verified by affidavit, providing] **and shall certify** that such vehicle meets the  
11 requirements which shall be issued by the director for classification as a "street rod", and a  
12 certificate of registration shall be issued therefor.

13         3. The director shall issue to the owner of any motor vehicle registered [under] **pursuant**  
14 **to** this section two license plates containing the number assigned to the registration certificate  
15 issued by the director of revenue, and the following words: "Street Rod"[, "State of Missouri"].  
16 Such license plates shall be kept securely attached to the motor vehicle registered hereunder.  
17 [The advisory committee established in section 301.129 shall determine the characteristic

18 features of such license plates for vehicles registered under the provisions of this section so that  
19 they may be recognized as such, except that] Such license plates shall be made with fully  
20 reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and  
21 shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.

22 4. Motor vehicles registered [under] **pursuant to** this section are subject to the motor  
23 vehicle safety inspection requirements of sections 307.350 to 307.390, RSMo.

301.142. 1. As used in this section the term "physically disabled" means a natural person  
2 who is a blind person, as defined in section 8.700, RSMo, or a natural person with disabilities  
3 which limit or impair the ability to walk, as determined by a licensed physician as follows:

4 (1) The person cannot walk fifty feet without stopping to rest; or

5 (2) The person cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from, a brace, cane, crutch,  
6 another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive device; or

7 (3) Is restricted by lung disease to such an extent that the person's forced respiratory  
8 expiratory volume for one second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one liter, or the  
9 arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty mm/hg on room air at rest; or

10 (4) Uses portable oxygen; or

11 (5) Has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are  
12 classified in severity as class III or class IV according to standards set by the American Heart  
13 Association; or

14 (6) Is severely limited in the applicant's ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological,  
15 or orthopedic condition.

16 2. "Temporarily disabled person" means a physically disabled person whose disability  
17 or incapacity can be expected to last for not more than one hundred eighty days.

18 3. Owners of motor vehicles who are residents of the state of Missouri, and who are  
19 physically disabled, owners of motor vehicles operated at least fifty percent of the time by a  
20 physically disabled person, or owners of motor vehicles used to transport physically disabled  
21 members of the owner's household may obtain disabled person license plates. Such owners,  
22 upon application, accompanied by the documents and fees provided for in this section, and by  
23 state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles shall be issued  
24 motor vehicle license plates for vehicles, other than commercial vehicles with a gross weight in  
25 excess of twenty-four thousand pounds, upon which shall be inscribed the international  
26 wheelchair accessibility symbol and the word "disabled" in addition to a combination of letters  
27 and numbers. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common  
28 color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as  
29 prescribed by section 301.130. Handicapped parking places may only be used when a physically  
30 disabled occupant is in the motor vehicle at the time of parking or when a physically disabled

31 person is being delivered or collected by a properly marked vehicle which is parked for the sole  
32 use of the physically disabled person. No vehicle shall park in the access aisle. Such parking  
33 violation shall be an infraction. The use of a vehicle displaying a disabled license plate or  
34 windshield placard to park in a parking space designated for the disabled by a person not  
35 transporting the individual for whom the license or placard was issued shall be an infraction.  
36 Upon conviction thereof, violators shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor  
37 more than three hundred dollars.

38 4. No additional fee shall be paid to the director of revenue for the issuance of the special  
39 license plates provided in this section, except for special personalized license plates and other  
40 license plates described in this subsection. Priority for any specific set of special license plates  
41 shall be given to the applicant who received the number in the immediately preceding license  
42 period subject to the applicant's compliance with the provisions of this section and any applicable  
43 rules or regulations issued by the director. If determined feasible by the advisory committee  
44 established in section 301.129, any special license plate issued pursuant to this section may be  
45 adapted to also include the international wheelchair accessibility symbol and the word "disabled"  
46 as prescribed in subsection 3 of this section and such plate may be issued to any applicant who  
47 meets the requirements of this section and the other appropriate provision of this chapter, subject  
48 to the requirements and fees of the appropriate provision of this chapter.

49 5. Any physically disabled person, or the parent or guardian of any such person, or any  
50 not for profit group, organization, or other entity which transports more than one physically  
51 disabled person, may apply to the director of revenue for a removable windshield placard to be  
52 hung from the rearview mirror of a parked motor vehicle. When there is no rearview mirror, the  
53 placard shall be displayed on the dashboard on the driver's side. The removable windshield  
54 placard shall conform to the specifications, in respect to size, color, and content, as set forth in  
55 federal regulations published by the Department of Transportation. The fee for each removable  
56 windshield placard shall be two dollars and the removable windshield placard shall be renewed  
57 every year. Only one removable placard may be issued to an applicant who has been issued  
58 disabled person license plates. Upon request, one additional windshield placard shall be issued  
59 to an applicant who has not been issued disabled person license plates. A temporary windshield  
60 placard shall be issued to any physically disabled person, or the parent or guardian of any such  
61 person who otherwise qualifies except that the physical disability, in the opinion of the physician,  
62 is not expected to exceed a period of one hundred eighty days. The temporary windshield  
63 placard shall conform to the specifications, in respect to size, color, and content, as set forth in  
64 federal regulations published by the Department of Transportation. The fee for the temporary  
65 windshield placard shall be two dollars. Upon request, one additional temporary windshield  
66 placard shall be issued to an applicant. Temporary windshield placards shall be issued upon

67 presentation of the physician's statement provided by this section and shall be displayed in the  
68 same manner as removable windshield placards. A person or entity shall be qualified to possess  
69 and display a temporary removable windshield placard for six months and the placard may be  
70 renewed once for an additional six months if a physician's statement pursuant to subsection 6 of  
71 this section is supplied to the director of revenue at the time of renewal. The placard shall be  
72 renewable only by the person or entity to which the placard was originally issued. Any placard  
73 issued pursuant to this section shall only be used when a physically disabled occupant is in the  
74 motor vehicle at the time of parking or when a physically disabled person is being delivered or  
75 collected by a properly marked vehicle which is parked for the sole use of the physically disabled  
76 person.

77         6. Application for license plates or windshield placards issued pursuant to this section  
78 shall be made to the director of revenue and shall be accompanied by a statement signed by a  
79 licensed physician which certifies that the applicant, user, or member of the applicant's  
80 household is a physically disabled person as defined by this section. The physician's statement  
81 shall be on a form prescribed by the director of revenue which shall include the physician's  
82 license number. If it is the professional opinion of the physician who issues the statement that  
83 the physical disability of the applicant, user, or member of the applicant's household is  
84 permanent, this shall be noted on the statement. In such instances, the applicant shall present the  
85 physician's statement which states that the applicant's disability is permanent to the director of  
86 revenue the first time the applicant applies for license plates or a removable windshield placard.  
87 The applicant shall not be required to obtain a new physician's statement each time that the  
88 applicant applies for or renews license plates or a removable windshield placard; but, the  
89 applicant shall present a physician's statement each time the applicant applies for a temporary  
90 windshield placard or renews a temporary windshield placard. Such physician's statement shall  
91 state the expiration date for the temporary windshield placard. If the physician fails to record an  
92 expiration date on the physician's statement, the director shall issue the temporary windshield  
93 placard for a period of thirty days. The director of revenue upon receiving a physician's  
94 statement pursuant to this subsection shall check with the state board of registration for the  
95 healing arts created in section 334.120, RSMo, or the Missouri state board of chiropractic  
96 examiners established in section 331.090, RSMo, with respect to physician's statements signed  
97 by licensed chiropractors, or with the board of optometry established in section 336.130, RSMo,  
98 with respect to physician's statements signed by licensed optometrists, or the state board of  
99 podiatric medicine created in section 330.100, RSMo, with respect to physician's statements  
100 signed by physicians of the foot or podiatrists to determine whether the physician is duly licensed  
101 and registered pursuant to law. The boards shall cooperate with the director and shall supply  
102 information requested pursuant to this subsection. The director may, in cooperation with the

103 boards which shall assist the director, establish a list of all physicians' names and of any other  
104 information necessary to administer this subsection within the department of revenue if the  
105 director determines that such listing is necessary to carry out the provisions of this subsection.

106         7. Where the owner's application is based on the fact that the vehicle is used at least fifty  
107 percent of the time by a physically disabled person, the applicant shall submit [an affidavit  
108 stating] **a statement** to this fact, in addition to the physician's statement. The [affidavit]  
109 **statement** shall be signed by both the owner of the vehicle and the physically disabled person.  
110 The applicant shall be required to submit this [affidavit] **statement** with each application for  
111 license plates.

112         8. The director of revenue shall enter into reciprocity agreements with other states for  
113 the purpose of recognizing disabled person license plates or windshield placards issued to  
114 physically disabled persons in those states.

115         9. When a person to whom disabled person license plates or a removable or temporary  
116 windshield placard or both have been issued dies, the personal representative of such person shall  
117 return the plates or placards or both to the director of revenue under penalty of law. The director  
118 of revenue may order any person issued disabled person license plates or windshield placards to  
119 submit to an examination by a chiropractor, osteopath, or physician, or to such other  
120 investigation as will determine whether such person qualifies for the special plates or placards.  
121 If such person refuses to submit or is found to no longer qualify for special plates or placards  
122 provided for in this section, the director of revenue shall collect the special plates or placards,  
123 and shall furnish license plates to replace the ones collected as provided by this chapter.

124         10. In the event a removable or temporary windshield placard is lost, stolen, or mutilated,  
125 the lawful holder thereof shall, within five days, file with the director of revenue an application  
126 and an affidavit stating such fact, in order to purchase a new placard. The fee for the  
127 replacement windshield placard shall be two dollars.

128         11. Beginning after September 1, 1998, and prior to August 31, 1999, the director of  
129 revenue shall authorize a one-time recertification and review of all permanent disabled person  
130 license plates and windshield placards, including physician's license numbers and related  
131 information that the director has on file pursuant to subsection 6 of this section to determine if  
132 such numbers and information are current and correct. The director shall require the presentation  
133 of a new physician's statement and other information deemed necessary by the director to  
134 administer the provisions of this section. The recertification and review shall be conducted in  
135 a manner as determined by the director.

136         12. Fraudulent application, renewal, issuance, procurement or use of disabled person  
137 license plates or windshield placards shall be a class A misdemeanor. It is a class B  
138 misdemeanor for a physician, chiropractor, podiatrist or optometrist to certify that an individual

139 or family member is qualified for a license plate or windshield placard based on a disability, the  
140 diagnosis of which is outside their scope of practice or if there is no basis for the diagnosis.

[301.144. 1. The director of revenue shall establish and issue special  
2 personalized license plates containing letters or numbers or combinations of letters  
3 and numbers, not to exceed six characters in length. Any person desiring to obtain  
4 a special personalized license plate for any motor vehicle other than a commercial  
5 motor vehicle licensed for more than twelve thousand pounds shall apply to the  
6 director of revenue on a form provided by the director and shall pay a fee of fifteen  
7 dollars in addition to the regular registration fees. The director of revenue shall issue  
8 rules and regulations setting the standards and establishing the procedure for  
9 application for and issuance of the special personalized license plates and shall  
10 provide a deadline each year for the applications. No rule or portion of a rule  
11 promulgated under the authority of this section shall become effective unless it has

14 pay a new fee each year he desires to obtain or retain special personalized license

18 fee established in this section, to the renewal applicant. Any person currently in  
19 possession of an approved personalized license plate shall have first priority on that

21 is made.

22 2. No personalized license plates shall be issued containing any letters,  
23 numbers or combination of letters and numbers which are obscene, profane,  
24 inflammatory or contrary to public policy. The director may recall any personalized  
25 license plates, including those issued prior to August 28, 1992, if he determines that  
26 the plates are obscene, profane, inflammatory or contrary to public policy. Where the  
27 director recalls such plates under the provisions of this subsection, he shall reissue

49 5. Notwithstanding any other provision to the contrary, any business listed  
50 in subsection 1 of section 301.256 that repossesses motor vehicles or trailers and sells  
51 or otherwise disposes of them shall be issued a placard displaying the word  
52 "Repossessed", provided such business pays the fees presently required of a  
53 manufacturer, distributor, or dealer in subsection 1 of section 301.253. Such placard  
54 shall bear a number and shall be in such form as the director of revenue shall  
55 determine, and shall be only used for demonstrations when displayed substantially  
56 as provided for number plates on the rear of the motor vehicle or trailer.]

301.144. 1. The director of revenue shall establish and issue [special] personalized  
2 license plates containing letters or numbers or combinations of letters and numbers. Such license  
3 plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall  
4 be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.  
5 Any person desiring to obtain a [special] personalized license plate for any motor vehicle other  
6 than **an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed [for more than**  
7 **twelve] in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight** shall apply to the director of  
8 revenue on a form provided by the director and shall pay a fee of fifteen dollars in addition to the  
9 regular registration fees. **Upon application for a personalized plate by the owner of a motor**  
10 **vehicle for which the owner has no registration plate available for transfer as prescribed**  
11 **by section 301.140, the director shall issue a temporary permit authorizing the operation**  
12 **of the motor vehicle, for a period not to exceed thirty days.** The director of revenue shall  
13 issue rules and regulations setting the standards and establishing the procedure for application  
14 for and issuance of the [special] personalized license plates and shall provide a deadline each  
15 year for the applications. [No rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to this section shall  
16 become effective until approved by the joint committee on administrative rules.] **Any rule or**  
17 **portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under**  
18 **the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and**  
19 **is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo. All rulemaking authority**  
20 **delegated prior to August 28, 2000, is of no force and effect and repealed. Nothing in this**  
21 **section shall be interpreted to repeal or affect the validity of any rule filed or adopted prior**  
22 **to the effective date of this section if it fully complied with the provisions of chapter 536,**  
23 **RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers**  
24 **vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the**

25 **effective date or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional,**  
26 **then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after the**  
27 **effective date of this section shall be invalid and void.** No two owners shall be issued  
28 identical plates. An owner shall make a new application and pay a new fee each year he **or she**  
29 desires to obtain or retain [special] personalized license plates; however, notwithstanding the  
30 provisions of subsection 8 of section 301.130 to the contrary, the director shall allow the  
31 [special] personalized license plates to be replaced with new plates every three years without any  
32 additional charge, above the fee established in this section, to the renewal applicant. Any person  
33 currently in possession of an approved personalized license plate shall have first priority on that

50 issue such plates in the same manner as [other special] personalized license plates are issued.

51         4. The director of revenue shall issue to residents of the state of Missouri who hold an  
52 unrevoked and unexpired official amateur radio license issued by the Federal Communications

56 **the words "AMATEUR RADIO" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE"**. The  
57 application shall be accompanied by [an affidavit] **a statement** stating that the applicant has an  
58 unrevoked and unexpired amateur radio license issued by the Federal Communications  
59 Commission and the official radio call letters assigned by the Federal Communications  
60 Commission to the applicant.

61           5. Notwithstanding any other provision to the contrary, any business listed in subsection  
62 1 of section 301.570 that repossesses motor vehicles or trailers and sells or otherwise disposes  
63 of them shall be issued a placard displaying the word "Repossessed", provided such business  
64 pays the fees presently required of a manufacturer, distributor, or dealer in section 301.560. Such  
65 placard shall bear a number and shall be in such form as the director of revenue shall determine,  
66 and shall be only used for demonstrations when displayed substantially as provided for number  
67 plates on the rear of the motor vehicle or trailer.

          301.145. Any person who has been awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor may  
2 apply for [special] **Congressional Medal of Honor** motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle  
3 [he] **the person** owns, either solely or jointly, other than **an apportioned motor vehicle or a**  
4 commercial [vehicles weighing over twelve] **motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen**  
5 thousand pounds[, as provided in this section] **gross weight**. Any such person shall make  
6 application for the [special] license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and  
7 furnish such proof of receipt of the Congressional Medal of Honor as the director may require.  
8 The director shall then issue license plates bearing the words "CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF  
9 HONOR" [in a form prescribed by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, except  
10 that]. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common color  
11 scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as  
12 prescribed by section 301.130. **There shall be no fee charged for plates issued pursuant to**  
13 **this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be**  
14 **charged for the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to this section. There shall**  
15 **be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified pursuant to this section**  
16 **may obtain so long as each set of plates issued pursuant to this section is issued for vehicles**  
17 **owned solely or jointly by such person.**

          301.192. 1. In addition to any other requirements of section 301.190, when application  
2 is made for a certificate of ownership for a motor vehicle or trailer seven years old or older and  
3 the value of vehicle does not exceed three thousand dollars, for which no record of any prior  
4 application for a certificate of ownership exists in the records of the director of revenue or for  
5 which the records of the director of revenue reflect incomplete or conflicting documentation of  
6 ownership, the director of revenue may issue a certificate of ownership, not less than thirty days  
7 after receiving the completed application, provided it is accompanied by:

- 8           (1) [An affidavit] **A statement** explaining how the motor vehicle or trailer was acquired  
9 and the reasons a valid certificate of ownership cannot be furnished;
- 10           (2) Presentation of all evidence of ownership in the applicant's possession;
- 11           (3) Title verification from a state in which the vehicle was previously titled or registered  
12 if known, provided the vehicle was so previously titled or registered;

13 (4) A notarized lien release from any lienholder of record;

14 (5) A vehicle examination certificate issued by the Missouri state highway patrol, or  
15 other law enforcement agency as authorized by the director of revenue. The vehicle examination  
16 shall include a verification of the vehicle's identification number and a determination that the  
17 vehicle has not been reported stolen in Missouri or any other state. The fee for the vehicle  
18 examination certificate shall be twenty-five dollars and shall be collected by the director of  
19 revenue at the time of the request for the application;

20 (6) A statement certifying the odometer reading of the motor vehicle if less than ten years  
21 of age; and

22 (7) A surety bond or a suitable financial security instrument in a form prescribed by the  
23 director of revenue and executed by the applicant and a person authorized to conduct surety  
24 business in this state. The bond shall be an amount equal to two times the value of the vehicle  
25 as determined by the Kelly Blue Book, NADA Used Car Guide or two appraisals from a licensed  
26 motor vehicle dealer. The bond shall be for a minimum of one hundred dollars and conditioned  
27 to indemnify any prior owner or lienholder and any subsequent purchaser of the vehicle or person  
28 acquiring any security interest in it, and their respective successors in interest, against any  
29 expense, loss or damage including reasonable attorneys fees, by reason of the issuance of the  
30 certificate of ownership of the vehicle or on account of any defect in or undisclosed security  
31 interest upon the right, title and interest of the applicant in and to the vehicle. Any such  
32 interested person has a right of action to recover on the bond for any breach of its conditions, but  
33 the aggregate liability of the surety to all persons shall not exceed the amount of the bond. The  
34 bond shall be returned at the end of three years, unless the department has been notified of the  
35 pendency of an action to recover on the bond.

36 2. Upon satisfaction with the genuineness of the application and supporting documents,  
37 the director of revenue shall issue a new certificate of ownership. The certificate of ownership  
38 shall appropriately be designated with the words "BONDED VEHICLE".

301.215. 1. When the holder of any indebtedness secured by a security agreement or  
2 other contract for security covering a motor vehicle or trailer repossesses the motor vehicle or  
3 trailer either by legal process or in accordance with the terms of a contract authorizing the  
4 repossession of the vehicle without legal process, the holder may obtain a certificate of  
5 ownership from the director of revenue upon presentation of (1) an application which shall be  
6 upon a blank form furnished by the director of revenue and shall contain a full description of the  
7 motor vehicle or trailer and the manufacturer's or other identifying number; (2) [an affidavit] a  
8 **statement** of the holder that the debtor defaulted in payment of the debt, and that the holder  
9 repossessed the motor vehicle or trailer either by legal process or in accordance with the terms  
10 of the contract, and the specific address where the vehicle or trailer is held; and (3) the original

11 or a conformed or photostatic copy of the original of the security agreement or other contract for  
12 security and the instrument or instruments evidencing the indebtedness secured by the security  
13 agreement or other contract for security. The director may by regulation prescribe for the  
14 inclusion in either or both the application or [affidavit] **statement** any other information [that  
15 he from time to time deems] **deemed** necessary or advisable and may prescribe that the  
16 [affidavit] **statement** be part of the application.

17 2. Upon the holder's presentation of the papers and payment of a fee of ten dollars, the  
18 director of revenue, if [he is] satisfied with the genuineness of the papers, shall issue and deliver  
19 to the holder a certificate of ownership which shall be in its usual form except it shall be clearly  
20 captioned "Repossessed Title"; provided, however, that unless the application is accompanied  
21 by the written consent, acknowledged before an officer authorized to take acknowledgments, of  
22 the owners and other lienholders, if any, of the motor vehicle or trailer as shown by the last prior  
23 certificate of ownership, if any, issued on the motor vehicle or trailer, for the issuance of a  
24 repossessed title to the applicant, no such repossessed title may be issued by the director of  
25 revenue unless the director shall first give ten days' written notice by first class United States  
26 mail postage prepaid to each of the owners and other lienholders, if any, of the motor vehicle or  
27 trailer at each of their last mailing addresses as shown by the last prior certificate of ownership,  
28 if any, issued on the motor vehicle or trailer, that an application for a repossessed title has been  
29 made and the date the repossessed title will be issued, and the notice shall be accompanied by  
30 a copy, photostatic or otherwise, of each the application and [affidavit] **statement**. The  
31 application for repossessed title may be withdrawn by the applicant at any time before the  
32 granting thereof. Each repossessed title so issued shall for all purposes be treated as an original  
33 certificate of ownership and shall supersede the outstanding certificate of ownership, if any, and  
34 duplicates thereof, if any, on the motor vehicle or trailer, all of which shall become null and void.

35 3. In any case where there is no certificate of ownership or duplicate thereof outstanding  
36 in the name of the debtor on the repossessed motor vehicle or trailer, the director of revenue shall  
37 issue a repossessed title to the holder and shall proceed to collect all unpaid fees, taxes, charges  
38 and penalties from the debtor as provided in section 301.190.

301.300. 1. In event of the loss, theft, mutilation or destruction of any certificate of  
2 ownership, number plate, tab or set of tabs issued by the director of revenue, the lawful holder  
3 thereof shall, within five days, file with the director of revenue, [an affidavit] **a statement**  
4 showing such fact, and shall, on the payment of a fee of eight dollars and fifty cents, obtain a  
5 duplicate or replacement of such plate, certificate, tab or set of tabs. Any duplicate certificate  
6 issued for any "motor vehicle primarily for business use", as defined in section 301.010, shall  
7 be issued only to the owner of record.

8 2. Upon filing [affidavit] **a statement** of lost, stolen, mutilated or destroyed certificate

9 of registration, the director of revenue shall issue to the lawful owner a duplicate or replacement  
10 thereof upon payment of a fee of eight dollars and fifty cents.

11 3. Vehicle owners who elect not to transfer or renew multiyear plates shall be charged  
12 a fee equal to that charged for a lost plate in addition to the registration fee prescribed by law at  
13 the time the new plate or plates are issued.

301.340. 1. Municipalities, by ordinance, may levy and collect license taxes from the  
2 owners of and dealers in motor vehicles, residing in such municipalities, and may require the  
3 display of license plates or stickers. Municipal license taxes, including the cost of plates, stickers  
4 and notarial fees shall not exceed the amounts in effect on September 28, 1985, or the amounts  
5 approved by the voters of the municipality on or after September 28, 1985, whichever is greater.

6 2. Upon approval of the voters of any city, the amount of the motor vehicle license tax  
7 imposed by such city shall be:

8 (1) Uniform for all motor vehicles; or

9 (2) At three different rates for passenger cars, trucks, and motorcycles; or

10 (3) At rates which are based on the horsepower of motor vehicles other than commercial  
11 motor vehicles and the tonnage of commercial motor vehicles.

12 3. Other provisions of the law to the contrary notwithstanding, any motor vehicle license  
13 tax imposed by any city may, by ordinance recommended by the license collector of such city,  
14 be included as a charge on bills issued for personal property taxes and may be collected, with and  
15 in the same payment as personal property taxes, by the collector of revenue. The collector of  
16 revenue may collect delinquent receipts of such motor vehicle license taxes, and penalties  
17 thereon, in the same manner and form as provided by law for the collection of delinquent ad  
18 valorem property taxes.

19 4. No municipal license tax shall be collected from a resident of any municipality for  
20 motor vehicles used exclusively outside of such municipality, and that fact may be shown by [an  
21 affidavit] **a statement** of the motor vehicle owner for the purpose of securing a state registration  
22 certificate without producing a receipt for municipal license taxes. When the owner of any motor  
23 vehicle or trailer, or chauffeur, or registered operator shall have complied with the requirements  
24 of this section, he **or she** shall not be required to pay any license tax or fee to any municipality,  
25 or to submit to any other requirement, except as authorized by this section, in any municipality  
26 of this state.

27 5. Municipalities may impose occupation taxes on the business of transporting  
28 passengers, freight and merchandise for hire carried on within their limits, and may measure such  
29 taxes by the number of motor vehicles engaged in such transportation.

30 6. At no time shall any municipality propose a percentage increase in the municipal  
31 license tax on commercial motor vehicles higher than that of other motor vehicles.

32           7. In lieu of the license tax prescribed pursuant to this section, the governing body of any  
33 city in which the voters of the city have approved such a license tax may submit to the qualified  
34 voters of the city a proposal to either increase the city property tax levy imposed pursuant to  
35 sections 94.010 to 94.330, RSMo, or increase the city sales tax levied pursuant to sections 94.510  
36 to 94.550, RSMo, by an amount to generate approximately the same amount of revenue as the  
37 license tax prescribed by this section generates. No such proposal shall become effective unless  
38 and until the majority of the qualified voters in the city approve such proposal at a citywide  
39 election held for such purpose. Any proposal approved by the voters shall cause the property or  
40 sales tax to increase by the approved amount and shall cause the motor vehicle license tax  
41 imposed pursuant to this section to be eliminated in that city.

301.370. 1. Nothing in sections 301.010 to 301.440 shall be construed to prohibit the  
2 owner of a duly registered motor vehicle from removing the motor or engine from such vehicle  
3 and replacing it with a new or reconditioned motor or engine of the same make or manufacture.

4           2. The owner and the person removing and replacing such motor or engine shall join in  
5 [an affidavit] **a statement** showing the number of the motor or engine removed, the date of  
6 removal, the reason for removal, and a description of the motor or engine replaced in the vehicle.

7           3. If the motor to be installed is a reconditioned motor, it shall bear the same number as  
8 the motor removed but shall be preceded by the symbol "RC". If the motor installed is a new  
9 motor, it shall bear a special number to be secured as provided in section 301.380.

10          4. The [affidavit] **statement**, together with the original certificate of title, shall be sent  
11 to the director of revenue at Jefferson City, Missouri, with a fee of one dollar for registering such  
12 change of motor or engine. The director of revenue shall file the [affidavit] **statement** and  
13 certificate in his **or her** office and shall issue and deliver a new certificate of title to the owner.

14          5. The owner of a motor vehicle that is identified on the appropriate Missouri certificate  
15 of ownership by a manufacturer's number other than the engine or motor number shall be exempt  
16 from the provisions of subsections 2, 3 and 4.

17          6. The director of revenue may adopt and enforce the rules and regulations, compatible  
18 with this chapter, that [he deems] **deemed** necessary to properly administer this section.

**301.437. Any person who makes a false statement or declaration to the director of  
2 revenue pursuant to any provisions of sections 301.010 through 301.800, shall be guilty of  
3 a class A misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars or a term  
4 of imprisonment not exceeding one year.**

**301.438. An emblem, seal or logo reproduced on a license plate pursuant to chapter  
2 301, RSMo, shall be reproduced in as clear and defined a manner as possible. If the  
3 emblem, seal or logo is unacceptable to an organization authorizing the use of such  
4 emblem, seal or logo, then it shall be the responsibility of the organization to furnish the**

5 **artwork, contained in the emblem, seal or logo, in a digitized format.**

301.441. Any person who is a retired member of the United States Army, Navy, Air  
2 Force, Marine Corps or Coast Guard may apply for [issuance of special] **retired military** motor  
3 vehicle license plates for any [passenger motor vehicle subject to the registration fees provided  
4 in section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property carrying] **motor vehicle the person owns, either**  
5 **solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a** commercial motor vehicle  
6 licensed [for a gross weight of nine thousand one pounds to twelve] **in excess of eighteen**  
7 thousand pounds [as provided in section 301.057, whether such vehicle is owned solely or  
8 jointly] **gross weight. There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person**  
9 **qualified pursuant to this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued**  
10 **pursuant to this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.** No  
11 additional fee shall be charged for [a set of special] license plates issued pursuant to this section.  
12 **Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for**  
13 **the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to this section.** Such person shall make  
14 application for the [special] license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and  
15 furnish such proof of retired status from that particular branch of the United States armed forces  
16 as the director may require. The plates shall have a white background with a blue and red  
17 configuration [at the discretion of the advisory committee established in section 301.129]. The  
18 director shall then issue license plates bearing the words "RETIRED MILITARY" in preference  
19 to the words "SHOW-ME STATE" [in a form prescribed by the advisory committee established  
20 in section 301.129]. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material, shall be  
21 clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.

301.443. 1. Any legal resident of the state of Missouri who is a veteran of service in the  
2 armed forces of the United States and has been honorably discharged from such service and who  
3 is a former prisoner of war and any legal resident of the state of Missouri who is a former  
4 prisoner of war and who was a United States citizen not in the armed forces of the United States  
5 during such time is, upon filing an application for registration together with such information and  
6 proof in the form of a statement from the United States Veterans Administration or the  
7 Department of Defense or any other form of proof as the director may require, entitled to receive  
8 annually one certificate of registration and one set of license plates or other evidence of  
9 registration as provided in section 301.130 for [a motor] **any vehicle the person owns, either**  
10 **solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a** commercial motor vehicle  
11 licensed in excess of [twelve] **eighteen** thousand pounds gross weight. There shall be no fee  
12 charged for **the first set of** license plates issued [under the provisions of] **pursuant to this**  
13 **section, but a fee of fifteen dollars in addition to the regular registration fees may be**  
14 **charged for each subsequent set of license plates issued pursuant to this section for each**

15 **other vehicle owned and titled to such person. Notwithstanding the provisions of section**  
16 **301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of license plates issued**  
17 **pursuant to this section.**

18 2. [Not more than one certificate of registration and one corresponding set of motor  
19 vehicle license plates or other evidence of registration as provided in section 301.130 shall be  
20 issued each year to a qualified former prisoner of war under this section.] **There shall be no**  
21 **limit on the number of license plates any person qualified pursuant to this section may**  
22 **obtain so long as each set of license plates issued pursuant to this section is issued for**  
23 **vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.**

24 3. Proof of ownership and vehicle inspection of the particular motor vehicle for which  
25 a registration certificate and set of license plates is requested [must] **shall** be shown at the time  
26 of application. Proof of status as a former prisoner of war as required in subsection 1 of this  
27 section shall only be required on the initial application.

28 4. As used in this section, "former prisoner of war" means any person who was taken as  
29 an enemy prisoner during World War I, World War II, the Korean conflict, or the Vietnam  
30 conflict.

31 5. The director shall furnish each former prisoner of war obtaining a set of license plates  
32 [under the provisions of] **pursuant to** subsections 1 to 4 of this section [special] plates which  
33 shall have the words "FORMER P.O.W." on the license plates in preference to the words  
34 "SHOW-ME STATE" [as provided in section 301.130 in a form prescribed by the advisory  
35 committee established in section 301.129]. Such license plates shall be made with fully  
36 reflective material, shall have a white background with a blue and red configuration [at the  
37 discretion of the advisory committee established in section 301.129], shall be clearly visible at  
38 night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.

39 6. Registration certificates and license plates issued [under the provisions of] **pursuant**  
40 **to** this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any registered co-owner  
41 of the motor vehicle will be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year  
42 licensed in the event of the death of the qualified former prisoner of war.

43 7. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 6 of this section to the contrary, the  
44 surviving spouse of a former prisoner of war who has not remarried and who has been issued  
45 license plates described in subsection 5 of this section shall be entitled to transfer such license  
46 plates to the motor [vehicle] **vehicles** of the surviving spouse and receive annually one certificate  
47 of registration and one set of license plates or other evidence of registration as provided in  
48 section 301.130 **per vehicle owned by and titled to such spouse** as if a former prisoner of war  
49 until remarriage. There shall be no fee charged for the transfer of such license plates.

50 (2) The department of revenue shall promulgate rules for the obtaining of a set of license

51 plates described in subsection 5 of this section by the surviving spouse of the former prisoner of  
52 war when such license plates are not issued prior to the death of the former prisoner of war. The  
53 surviving spouse shall be entitled to receive annually one certificate of registration and one set  
54 of license plates or other evidence of registration as provided in section 301.130 **per vehicle**  
55 **owned by and titled to such spouse** as if a former prisoner of war until remarriage. There shall  
56 be no fee charged for the **first set of** license plates issued pursuant to this subdivision, **but a fee**  
57 **of fifteen dollars in addition to the regular registration fees may be charged for each**  
58 **subsequent set of license plates issued pursuant to this subdivision for each other vehicle**  
59 **owned and titled to such spouse. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no**  
60 **additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to**  
61 **this section.**

301.444. 1. Owners or a joint owner of motor vehicles who are residents of the state of  
2 Missouri, and who are directors of a fire protection district or who are compensated, partially  
3 compensated or volunteer members of any fire department, fire protection district or voluntary  
4 fire protection association in this state, upon application accompanied by [affidavit] **a statement**  
5 as prescribed in this section, complying with the state motor vehicle laws relating to registration  
6 and licensing of motor vehicles, and upon payment of a fee as prescribed in this section, shall  
7 be issued [a set of] license plates for [noncommercial vehicles or a commercial motor vehicle  
8 licensed for no more than twelve thousand pounds] **any motor vehicle other than an**  
9 **apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen**  
10 **thousand pounds gross weight.** The license plates shall be inscribed with a variation of the  
11 Maltese cross that signifies the universally recognized symbol for firefighters. In addition, upon  
12 such set of license plates shall be inscribed, in lieu of the words "Show-me State", the word  
13 "FIREFIGHTER" in addition to a combination of letters and numbers in a form prescribed by  
14 the advisory committee established in section 301.129. Such license plates shall be made with  
15 fully reflective material, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as  
16 prescribed by section 301.130.

17 2. Applications for license plates issued [under] **pursuant to** this section shall be made  
18 to the director of revenue and shall be accompanied by [an affidavit] **a statement** stating that the  
19 applicant is a person described in subsection 1 of this section. Any person who is lawfully in  
20 possession of such plates who resigns, is removed, or otherwise terminates or is terminated from  
21 [his] **such person's** association with such fire department, fire protection district or voluntary  
22 fire protection association shall return such [special] plates to the director within fifteen days.

23 3. [An additional annual fee equal to that charged for personalized license plates in  
24 section 301.144] **A fee of fifteen dollars in addition to the regular registration fees** shall be  
25 paid to the director of revenue for the issuance of the license plates provided for in this section.

26 **Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for**  
27 **the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to this section. There shall be no limit**  
28 **on the number of license plates any person qualified pursuant to this section may obtain**  
29 **so long as each set of license plates issued pursuant to this section are issued for vehicles**  
30 **owned solely or jointly by such person.**

301.445. Any person who has been awarded the combat infantry badge may apply for  
2 [special] **combat infantryman** motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle such person owns,  
3 either solely or jointly, [for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to the registration  
4 fees provided in section 301.055, or for a nonlocal property-carrying] **other than an**  
5 **apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed [for a gross weight not in**  
6 **excess of twelve] in excess of eighteen** thousand pounds [as provided in section 301.057] **gross**  
7 **weight.** Any such person shall make application for the [special] license plates on a form  
8 provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof as a recipient of the combat infantry  
9 badge as the director may require. **Upon presentation of proof of eligibility,** the director shall  
10 then issue license plates bearing the words "COMBAT INFANTRYMAN" in place of the words  
11 "SHOW-ME STATE" [in a form prescribed by the director, except that such license plates shall  
12 be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with a blue and red  
13 configuration at the discretion of the director, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be  
14 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130]. Such plates shall also bear an image  
15 of the combat infantry badge]. There shall be an additional fee charged for each set of special  
16 combat infantry badge license plates issued equal to the fee charged for personalized license  
17 plates in section 301.144. No more than one set of combat infantry badge license plates shall be  
18 issued to a qualified applicant.] **and shall have a common blue and white color scheme and**  
19 **design in a manner prescribed by the director of the department of revenue. There shall**  
20 **be a fee of fifteen dollars in addition to the regular registration fees charged for plates**  
21 **issued pursuant to this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no**  
22 **additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to**  
23 **this section. There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified**  
24 **pursuant to this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued pursuant to**  
25 **this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.** License plates  
26 issued pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other person  
27 except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate the motor  
28 vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the  
29 qualified person.

301.447. 1. Any member of the United States Military Service who was stationed on or  
2 within three miles of the Hawaiian Island of Oahu on December 7, 1941, during the enemy attack

3 on Pearl Harbor and other related military installations may apply for [special] **Pearl Harbor**  
4 motor vehicle license plates for [one] **any** vehicle [he] **the person** owns, either solely or jointly,  
5 [as provided in this section] **other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor**  
6 **vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight.** Any such person shall  
7 make application for the [special] license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue  
8 and pay [an additional fee equal to the fee charged for personalized license plates in section  
9 301.144 for the issuance of the license plates provided for herein] **a fee of fifteen dollars in**  
10 **addition to the regular registration fees charged for plates issued pursuant to this section.**  
11 **Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for**  
12 **the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to this section.** Applications for license  
13 plates issued [under] **pursuant to** this section shall be accompanied by such proof of eligibility  
14 as the director may require.

15         2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.130, each such license plate shall be  
16 embossed with the words "PEARL HARBOR SURVIVOR" at the bottom of the plate [in the  
17 form prescribed by the advisory committee established in section 301.129]. Such license plates  
18 shall be made with fully reflective material, shall have a white background with a blue and red  
19 configuration [at the discretion of the advisory committee established in section 301.129], shall  
20 be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.  
21 [Such plates shall be available for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to the  
22 registration fees provided in section 301.055, or to nonlocal property-carrying commercial motor  
23 vehicles licensed for a gross weight of six thousand pounds up through and including twelve  
24 thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057.]

25         3. [No more than one set of Pearl Harbor survivor plates shall be issued to a qualified  
26 applicant.] **There shall be no limit on the number of license plates any person qualified**  
27 **pursuant to this section may obtain so long as each set of license plates issued pursuant to**  
28 **this section is issued for vehicles owned solely or jointly by such person.** License plates  
29 issued [under] **pursuant to** the provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other  
30 person except as provided herein. Any registered co-owner of a motor vehicle will be entitled  
31 to operate the motor vehicle for the duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the  
32 qualified applicant. Pearl Harbor survivor plates issued [under] **pursuant to** the provisions of  
33 this section shall be transferable only to a widow or widower of a Pearl Harbor survivor.

301.448. Any person who has served and was honorably discharged or currently serves  
2 in any branch of the United States armed forces or reserves, the United States Coast Guard or  
3 reserve, the United States Merchant Marines or reserve or the Missouri national guard, or any  
4 subdivision of any of such services or a member of the United States Marine Corps League may  
5 apply for [special] motor vehicle license plates **pursuant to this section for any vehicle the**

6 **person owns**, either solely or jointly, [for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles subject to  
7 the registration fees provided in section 301.055, or to nonlocal property-carrying] **other than**  
8 **an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor [vehicles] vehicle** licensed [for a gross  
9 weight of six thousand pounds up through and including twelve] **in excess of eighteen thousand**  
10 **pounds [as provided in section 301.057] gross weight.** Any such person shall make application  
11 for the [special] license plates **authorized by this section** on a form provided by the director of  
12 revenue and furnish such proof that such person is a member or former member of any such  
13 branch of service as the director may require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and  
14 annual payment of [the fee required for personalized license plates in section 301.144, and other]  
15 **a fifteen-dollar fee in addition to the regular registration fees and presentation of documents**  
16 which may be required by law, the department shall issue personalized license plates which shall  
17 bear the seal, logo or emblem, along with a word or words designating the branch or subdivision  
18 of such service for which the person applies. **Notwithstanding the provisions of section**  
19 **301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of license plates issued**  
20 **pursuant to this section.** All seals, logos, emblems or special symbols shall become an integral  
21 part of the license plate; however, no plate shall contain more than one seal, logo, emblem or  
22 special symbol and the design of such plates shall be approved by the [advisory committee  
23 established in section 301.129] **director of revenue** and by the branch or subdivision of such  
24 service or the Marine Corps League prior to issuing such plates. The plates shall have a white  
25 background with a blue and red configuration [at the discretion of the advisory committee  
26 established in section 301.129]. The bidding process used to select a vendor for the material to  
27 manufacture the license plates authorized by this section shall consider the aesthetic appearance  
28 of the plate. The director of revenue shall make necessary rules and regulations for the  
29 enforcement of this section, and shall design all necessary forms. [The director of revenue shall  
30 not authorize the manufacture of the material to produce such license plates with the individual  
31 seal, logo, or emblem until such time he has received one hundred applications for such plates  
32 for each branch or subdivision of such service. License plates indicating army reserve, naval  
33 reserve, air force reserve, marine corps reserve, coast guard reserve, issued prior to January 1,  
34 1994, will still be in full force and effect until such time the one hundred minimum applications  
35 for such branch of service is met.] All license plates issued [under] **pursuant to** this provision  
36 must be renewed in accordance with law. License plates issued [under] **pursuant to** the  
37 provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other person, except that any registered  
38 co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the duration of  
39 the year licensed, in the event of the death of the qualified applicant. **There shall be no limit**  
40 **on the number of license plates any person qualified pursuant to this section may obtain**  
41 **so long as each set of license plates issued pursuant to this section is issued for vehicles**

42 **owned solely or jointly by such person.**

301.449. Any community college or four-year public or private institution of higher  
2 education located in the state of Missouri may authorize the use of its official emblem to be  
3 affixed on multiyear personalized license plates as provided in this section. Any contribution  
4 to such institution derived from this section, except reasonable administrative costs, shall be used  
5 for scholarship endowment or other academically related purposes. Any vehicle owner may  
6 annually apply to the institution for the use of the emblem. Upon annual application and  
7 payment of an emblem use contribution to the institution, which shall be set by the governing  
8 body of the institution at an amount of at least twenty-five dollars, the institution shall issue to  
9 the vehicle owner, without further charge, an "emblem use authorization statement", which shall  
10 be presented by the vehicle owner to the department of revenue at the time of registration. Upon  
11 presentation of the annual statement and payment of [the fee required for personalized license  
12 plates in section 301.144, and other] **a fifteen-dollar fee in addition to the regular registration**  
13 **fees and presentation of documents** which may be required by law, the department of revenue  
14 shall issue a [personalized] license plate, which shall bear the seal, emblem or logo of the  
15 institution, to the vehicle owner. **Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no**  
16 **additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to**  
17 **this section.** The license plate authorized by this section shall use the school colors of the  
18 institution, and those colors shall be constructed upon the license plate using a process to ensure  
19 that the school emblem shall be displayed upon the license plate in the clearest and most  
20 attractive manner possible. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material with  
21 a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically  
22 attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. The license plate authorized by this section shall  
23 be issued with a design approved by both the institution of higher education and the [advisory  
24 committee established in section 301.129] **director of revenue.** A vehicle owner, who was  
25 previously issued a plate with an institutional emblem authorized by this section and does not  
26 provide an emblem use authorization statement at a subsequent time of registration, shall be  
27 issued a new plate which does not bear the institutional emblem, as otherwise provided by law.  
28 The director of revenue shall make necessary rules and regulations for the enforcement of this  
29 section, and shall design all necessary forms including establishing a minimum number of license  
30 plates which can be issued with the authorized emblem of a participating institution.

301.451. Any person who has been awarded the purple heart medal may apply for  
2 [special] **purple heart** motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle [he] **the person** owns, either  
3 solely or jointly, other than **an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial [vehicles weighing**  
4 **over twelve thousand pounds] motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds**  
5 **gross weight.** Any such person shall make application for the [special] license plates on a form

6 provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof as a recipient of the purple heart  
7 medal as the director may require. The director shall then issue license plates bearing letters or  
8 numbers or a combination thereof, with the words "PURPLE HEART" in place of the words  
9 "SHOW-ME STATE" [in a form prescribed by the advisory committee established in section  
10 301.129]. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common color  
11 scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as  
12 prescribed by section 301.130. There shall be [an additional] **a fee of fifteen dollars in addition**  
13 **to the regular registration fees** charged for each set of [special] purple heart license plates  
14 [issued equal to the fee charged for personalized license plates], but the additional fee shall only  
15 have to be paid once by the qualified applicant at the time of initial application. [No more than  
16 two sets of purple heart license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.] **Notwithstanding**  
17 **the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for the personalization**  
18 **of license plates issued pursuant to this section.** License plates issued [under] **pursuant to**  
19 the provisions of this section shall not be transferable to any other person except that any  
20 registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to operate the motor vehicle for the  
21 duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.

301.453. 1. Any member of the general assembly of the state of Missouri while holding  
2 office, upon application [and], payment of [the fee required for personalized license plates in  
3 section 301.144, and other] **a fifteen-dollar fee in addition to the regular registration** fees and  
4 **presentation of** documents which may be required by law, may apply for [special personalized]  
5 license plates bearing the state seal in gold and black colors along with the words  
6 "Representative" or "Senator" in preference to the words "Show-Me State" **for any vehicle the**  
7 **member owns, either solely or jointly, other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a**  
8 **commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight.** The  
9 director of revenue shall annually set aside [special personalized] license plates bearing the  
10 letters and numbers S-1 to S-34 and S01 to S034, R-1 to R-163 and R01 to R0163 to be issued  
11 to a member of the general assembly of the state of Missouri while such member is holding that  
12 office, upon such member's written request. For the first set of [special personalized] license  
13 plates issued to a member of the general assembly, such plates shall bear the letter "S" and the  
14 number of the senator's district for a member of the state senate or the letter "R" and the number  
15 of the representative's district for a member of the house of representatives and for the second  
16 set of plates issued to a member of the general assembly, such plates shall bear the letter "S" and  
17 the number of the senator's district preceded by the numeral "0" for a member of the state senate  
18 or the letter "R" and the number of the representative's district preceded by the numeral "0" for  
19 a member of the house of representatives. Only two sets of such plates may be issued to any one  
20 member of the general assembly.

23 personalized plates in section 301.144] **a fifteen-dollar fee in addition to the regular**

28 House of Representatives, bearing the letters "USC" together with the number of the  
29 representative's district **for any vehicle the member owns, either solely or jointly, other than**  
30 **an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of eighteen**  
31 **thousand pounds gross weight.** Only one set of such plates may be issued to any one  
32 individual congressman.

33           3. The director shall annually set aside [special personalized] license plates bearing the

          301.454. Any school or nonprofit organization connected with and designated by a

5 nonprofit organization for the use of the emblem. Upon annual application and payment of a  
6 fifteen-dollar emblem-use contribution to any participating school or designated nonprofit  
7 organization, such school or nonprofit organization shall issue to the vehicle owner, without  
8 further charge, an "emblem-use authorization statement", which shall be presented by the vehicle  
9 owner to the department of revenue at the time of registration. Upon presentation of the annual  
10 statement [and], payment of [the fee required for personalized license plates in section 301.144,

12 which may be required by law, the department of revenue shall issue a [personalized] license  
13 plate, which shall bear the "helping schools" emblem described in this section, to the vehicle

301.456. Any person who has been awarded the military service award known as the  
2 "Silver Star" may apply for [special] **silver star** motor vehicle license plates for any vehicle  
3 [such] **the** person owns, either solely or jointly, [for issuance either to passenger motor vehicles  
4 subject to the registration fees provided in section 301.055 or for a nonlocal property-carrying]  
5 **other than an apportioned motor vehicle or a** commercial motor vehicle licensed [for a gross  
6 weight of nine thousand one pounds to twelve thousand pounds as provided in section 301.057]  
7 **in excess of eighteen thousand pounds gross weight.** Any such person shall make application  
8 for the [special] license plates on a form provided by the director of revenue and furnish such  
9 proof as a recipient of the silver star as the director may require. The director shall then issue  
10 license plates bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof [as determined by the advisory  
11 committee established in section 301.129], with the words "SILVER STAR" in place of the  
12 words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material  
13 with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be  
14 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. Such plates shall also bear an image  
15 of the silver star. There shall be [an additional fee] **a fee of fifteen dollars in addition to the**

6 Columbus derived from this section, except reasonable administrative costs, shall be used solely  
7 for the educational programs or purposes of the Knights of Columbus. Any member of the  
8 Knights of Columbus may annually apply for the use of the emblem.

9         2. Upon annual application and payment of a twenty-five dollar emblem-use contribution  
10 to the Knights of Columbus, the Knights of Columbus shall issue to the vehicle owner, without

17 numbers or combination thereof.

18         3. There shall be a **fifteen-dollar fee in addition to the regular registration fees**  
19 **charged for each set of Missouri junior chamber of commerce license plates [issued equal to the**  
20 **fee charged for personalized license plates in addition to other fees required by law].**  
21 **Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for**  
22 **the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to this section.** No more than one set  
23 of Missouri junior chamber of commerce license plates shall be issued to a qualified applicant.  
24 License plates issued [under] **pursuant to** the provisions of this section shall not be transferable  
25 to any other person except that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle shall be entitled to  
26 operate the motor vehicle with such plates for the duration of the year licensed in the event of  
27 the death of the qualified person.

**301.478. 1. A motor vehicle owner may receive license plates as prescribed in this**  
2 **section after an annual payment of an emblem-use authorization fee to the Missouri**  
3 **federation of square and round dance clubs. The Missouri federation of square and round**  
4 **dance clubs hereby authorizes the use of its official emblem to be affixed on multiyear**  
5 **license plates as provided in this section. Any contribution to the Missouri federation of**  
6 **square and round dance clubs derived from this section, except reasonable administrative**  
7 **costs, shall be used solely for the educational programs or purposes of the federation. Any**  
8 **motor vehicle owner may annually apply for the use of the emblem.**

9         2. Upon annual application and payment of a five-dollar emblem-use contribution  
10 **to the Missouri federation of square and round dance clubs, the federation shall issue to**  
11 **the vehicle owner, without further charge, an emblem-use authorization statement, which**  
12 **shall be presented by such owner to the department of revenue at the time of registration**  
13 **of a motor vehicle. Upon presentation of the annual statement, payment of a fifteen-dollar**  
14 **fee in addition to the regular registration fees and presentation of documents which may**  
15 **be required by law, the department of revenue shall issue license plates, which bear the**  
16 **emblem of the Missouri federation of square and round dance clubs, to the vehicle owner.**  
17 **Notwithstanding the provisions of section 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for**  
18 **the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to this section. Such license plates**  
19 **shall be made with fully reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall**  
20 **be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section**  
21 **301.130.**

22         3. A vehicle owner, who was previously issued a plate with the Missouri federation  
23 **of square and round dance clubs emblem authorized by this section but who does not**  
24 **provide an emblem-use authorization statement at a subsequent time of registration, shall**

25 **be issued a new plate which does not bear the federation emblem, as otherwise provided**  
26 **by law. The director of revenue shall make necessary rules and regulations for the**  
27 **administration and enforcement of this section, and shall design all necessary forms**  
28 **required by this section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the**  
29 **authority of this section shall become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to**  
30 **the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo.**

301.564. 1. Any person or [his] **such person's** agent licensed or registered as a  
2 manufacturer, motor vehicle dealer, wholesale motor vehicle dealer, boat dealer, wholesale  
3 motor vehicle auction or a public motor vehicle auction pursuant to the provisions of sections  
4 301.550 to 301.573, shall permit an employee of the department of revenue or any law  
5 enforcement official to inspect, during normal business hours, any of the following documents  
6 which are in [his] **such person's** possession or under [his] **such person's** custody or control:

- 7 (1) Any title to any motor vehicle or vessel;
- 8 (2) Any application for title to any motor vehicle or vessel;
- 9 (3) Any affidavit **or statement** provided pursuant to sections 301.550 to 301.573 or  
10 chapter 407, RSMo;
- 11 (4) Any assignment of title to any motor vehicle or vessel;
- 12 (5) Any disclosure statement or other document relating to mileage or odometer readings  
13 required by the laws of the United States or any other state;
- 14 (6) Any inventory and related documentation.

15 2. For purposes of this section, the term "law enforcement official" shall mean any of the  
16 following:

- 17 (1) Attorney general, or any person designated by [him] **the attorney general** to make  
18 such an inspection;
- 19 (2) Any prosecuting attorney or any person designated by a prosecuting attorney to make  
20 such an inspection;
- 21 (3) Any member of the highway patrol or water patrol;
- 22 (4) Any sheriff or deputy sheriff;
- 23 (5) Any peace officer certified pursuant to chapter 590, RSMo, acting in [his] **such**  
24 **peace officer's** official capacity.

301.711. 1. Upon receipt of the application for registration and the appropriate fee, the  
2 department of revenue shall issue a decal showing the registration number and expiration date.  
3 The decal shall be displayed at all times and be affixed to the right front fork or frame of the  
4 all-terrain vehicle where it is clearly visible.

5 2. The fee for registration of an all-terrain vehicle shall be ten dollars. The registration  
6 of an all-terrain vehicle shall be valid for a period of three years. The penalty fee of five dollars

7 shall be paid on all delinquent registrations at the time the owner makes application for  
8 registration.

9           3. In the event of the loss, mutilation or destruction of any certificate of registration or  
10 decal issued by the director of revenue, the lawful holder thereof shall, within five days, file with  
11 the director of revenue an application and [an affidavit] **a statement** stating such fact, and shall  
12 on the payment of seven dollars and fifty cents, obtain a duplicate of such certificate of  
13 registration or decal.

14           4. The director of revenue shall deposit all fees collected pursuant to sections 301.707  
15 to 301.714 in the state treasury to the credit of the general revenue fund.

301.800. 1. Any motor vehicle assembled by a two- or four-year institution of higher  
2 education exclusively utilizing solar power and built to compete in a national competition  
3 organized to foster interest in solar energy shall be registered and titled by the director of  
4 revenue, other laws regulating licensing of motor vehicles to the contrary notwithstanding.

5           2. Such institution shall file an application in a form prescribed by the director, [verified  
6 by affidavit] **accompanied by a statement**, that such vehicle meets the requirements of  
7 subsection 1 of this section.

8           3. The plate issued by the director shall be the collegiate plate of the institution and shall  
9 display the term "solar" in a manner prescribed by the director.

10           4. The institution shall pay the applicable fees as determined by the director.

11           5. Such motor vehicle shall be exempt from the inspections required by sections 307.350  
12 and 307.366, RSMo, and shall only be operated on the streets and highways with the approval  
13 of the institution of higher education.
