

House Resolution No. 87

Whereas, it is with great pleasure that the members of the Missouri House of Representatives pause to recognize the meritorious achievements of an outstanding Missouri citizen who has distinguished himself through excellence in athletics; and

Whereas, Ted Yeater has been chosen as the recipient of the Outstanding Athletic Achievement Award, an impressive accolade to be bestowed upon him during the St. Charles County Amateur Sports Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony to be held on January 26, 2002; and

Whereas, selected 1961 All-Star baseball player with the American Legion in St. Charles, Ted Yeater has enjoyed recognition by serving twenty-five years as Head Varsity Baseball Coach at Duchesne High School, where he won the 3A State Championship in 1984 and was 3A State Runner-Up in 1983; and

Whereas, during his longtime tenure with Duchesne High School, Ted Yeater also served twenty-two years as Head Varsity Basketball Coach, three years as Assistant Basketball Coach, four years as Assistant Football Coach, and ten years as Athletic Director; and

Whereas, Ted Yeater, who earned a Master's degree in Education from Fontbonne College in St. Louis, taught various mathematics classes for thirty-three years at Duchesne High School and one year at Francis Howell High School; and

Whereas, currently Head of the Computer Department at Duchesne High School, Ted Yeater also served as Head of the Mathematics Department for many years and as Administrative Assistant for seven years; and

Whereas, Ted Yeater participated in E.M.B.A. Baseball with the St. Peters Team from 1962 to 1974, Fast-Pitch Softball with BBB Trailer Sales from 1967 to the early 1970s, and was an Umpire for the Youth League Baseball and Softball Teams in St. Charles County from 1973 to 1980:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-first General Assembly, unanimously join in extending our most hearty and robust congratulations to Ted Yeater as he enjoys the honor of this high distinction and in wishing him continued success in the challenging years ahead; and
