

## House Resolution No. 125

**Whereas**, Earl Dean Engelbrecht of Holts Summit, Missouri, began what was to become a long and effective association with the Missouri Department of Corrections when he accepted teaching responsibilities at Algoa Correctional Center in September 1971; and

**Whereas**, Earl Engelbrecht shifted the location of his significant endeavors to the Renz Correctional Center in June 1974, where he diligently labored as a Caseworker, Casework Supervisor, and Functional Unit Manager, and to the Fulton Reception and Diagnostic Center in February 1995, where he has served as a Functional Unit Manager and Guidance Counselor; and

**Whereas**, during the past three decades, Earl Engelbrecht has developed an enviable reputation for his activities establishing comprehensive reception and diagnostics practices for incoming female inmates, writing and managing a federal grant for female first offenders, and serving on the Board of Directors for the Missouri Corrections Association, the inaugural committee for the Offender Classification Plan and its subsequent initial revision committee, Department of Corrections Substance Abuse Committee, Department of Corrections Computer Information Committee, and the Policy and Procedure Committees at Renz Correctional Center and the Fulton Reception and Diagnostic Center; and

**Whereas**, a member and Secretary of the Jefferson City Evening Lions Club for several years, Earl Engelbrecht worships at Grace Lutheran Church in Holts Summit where he has been widely praised as a member of the Building and Planning Committee and Debt Reduction Committee, an active participant in the building of the church, member of the Board of Elders, President of the Church Council, and current member of the Board of Trustees; and

**Whereas**, Earl Engelbrecht is retiring on March 1, 2002, after thirty years of steadfast commitment to his duties and responsibilities with the Department of Corrections:

**Now, therefore, be it resolved** that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-first General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the sterling career and exceptional achievements of Earl Engelbrecht during his time of service with the Missouri Department of Corrections and to convey to him this legislative body's heartiest best wishes for continued personal happiness and productivity during the golden years of retirement; and

**Be it further resolved** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution to recognize the well-deserved retirement of Earl Dean Engelbrecht from the Missouri Department of Corrections.
