

House Resolution No. 487

Whereas, it is with special pleasure that the members of the Missouri House of Representatives pause to recognize an outstanding Missouri citizen who has distinguished himself through many years of excellence in law enforcement; and

Whereas, John Hurlock, an esteemed resident of Lee's Summit, Missouri, is stepping down from his post with the Lee's Summit Police Department after three decades of exceptional service and dedication; and

Whereas, Sergeant Hurlock began his impressive tenure with the Lee's Summit Police Department as a Patrolman in 1972, since which time he has fulfilled the many duties and tasks placed before him as an Investigator with the CIS, Narcotics and Drug Unit, and Metro Drug Squad; Police Officer with the Operations Division, Patrol Section; Sergeant with the CIS, and Operations Division, Patrol Section; and Commander with the CIS, and Special Investigations Unit; and

Whereas, throughout his long and illustrious career as a law enforcement officer, Sergeant Hurlock has given many public awareness presentations on cults, gangs, and narcotics; worked closely with the DEA Task Force, ATF, IRS, and the FBI; and played an integral role in formalizing the Standard Operating Procedures and Guidelines for SIU, assisting in the development of the Department's Internal Affairs/Citizen Complaint Policy, and preparing the Department's Intelligence System and Polygraph policies; and

Whereas, Sergeant Hurlock earned his Associate's degree in Applied Science from Longview Community College and went on to attend Medical Examination Field Investigators School and basic and advanced drug enforcement courses at the United States Department of Justice, participate in a major case investigation course, and in 1981 received Polygraph Examiner Certification from Penn Valley Community College; and

Whereas, a proud recipient of numerous letters of commendation and the 1978 Jaycees Officer of the Year award, Sergeant Hurlock is exceedingly proud of his affiliation with the American Association of Police Polygraphists, Missouri Polygraph Association, the International Narcotic Enforcement Officers Association, the Jackson County Area Gang Task Force, the Lee's Summit Drug Task Force, the Metro Area Cult Task Force, the Mid-States Organized Crime Information Center, the Jackson County Juvenile Court, and the Texas Association of Law Enforcement Polygraph Investigators:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-first General Assembly, unanimously join in expressing our utmost appreciation to Sergeant Hurlock for his thirty years of unparalleled service to law enforcement, the Lee's Summit Police Department, and the citizenry of Jackson County; and
