

House Resolution No. 739

Whereas, a state employee for forty-seven years, Donald Victor Cline of Jefferson City, Missouri, stepped down from his diverse duties and responsibilities with the Missouri Department of Corrections on March 1, 2002; and

Whereas, beginning his esteemed employment record as a Caseworker at Missouri State Penitentiary, Donald Cline subsequently served as the appointed Secretary and Deputy Compact Administrator of the Missouri Board of Probation and Parole, a Juvenile Officer with the Fourteenth Judicial Circuit for the State Courts Administrator's Office and the Director of Court Services for the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit, Functional Unit Manager, Corrections Superintendent II of the Boonville Correctional Center, Associate Superintendent of Program Services at Missouri State Penitentiary, and Corrections Superintendent III; and

Whereas, born in Aurora, Missouri, and married to Carolyn Frances Schrimpf on June 26, 1954, Donald Cline served as President of the Missouri Juvenile Officer's Association from 1964 to 1965, member of the Jefferson City Council's Third Ward from 1964 to 1966, member and Chairman of the Jefferson City Police Personnel Board and member of the Missouri Supreme Court Ad Hoc Committee on Juvenile Court Rules of Procedures from 1968 to 1979, Chairman of the Missouri Association of Drug Enforcement in 1973, operator of "A Community Mental First-Aid Service" Crisis Line from 1973 to 1976, member of the Missouri Advisory Board on Alcohol and Drug Abuse from 1974 to 1977, clinical member of the American Association of Family and Mental Therapy in 1976, and member of the Missouri Task Force on Alcohol and Drug Plan in 1977; and

Whereas, the loving father of David Mark, Daniel Stephen, Dana Paul and Diana Frances, Donald Cline earned Bachelor of Science in criminal justice, Master of Education in counseling, and Master in Administration in sociology degrees and certification in Reality Therapy and Substance Abuse Counseling:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-first General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the exemplary career and impressive life of Donald Cline with the Missouri Department of Corrections and to convey to him this legislative body's heartiest congratulations and best wishes as he partakes of the special opportunities and pleasures traditionally associated with the golden years of retirement; and
