AN ACT

To amend chapter 301, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to special license plates.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 301, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be
2 known as section 301.3090, to read as follows:

**301.3090. Any person who is serving on active duty in any branch of the United
2 States military and is part of Operation Enduring Freedom may receive special motor
3 vehicle license plates for any motor vehicle such person owns, either solely or jointly, other
4 than an apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of
5 eighteen thousand pounds gross weight. Individuals who served on active duty in any
6 branch of the United States military during Operation Enduring Freedom and were
7 honorably discharged may also apply for these special license plates as set forth in this
8 section. Any such person shall make application for the special license plates on a form
9 provided by the director of revenue and furnish such proof of current service in Operation
10 Enduring Freedom or proof of status as an honorably discharged veteran as the director
11 may require. Upon presentation of the proof of eligibility and annual payment of the fee
12 required for personalized license plates prescribed by section 301.144, and other fees and
13 documents which may be required by law, the director shall then issue license plates**

14 bearing letters or numbers or a combination thereof as determined by the advisory
15 committee established in section 301.129, with the words "OPERATION ENDURING
16 FREEDOM" in place of the words "SHOW-ME STATE". Such plates shall also bear an
17 image of the American flag. The plates shall be clearly visible at night and shall be
18 aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130. No more than one set of special
19 license plates shall be issued pursuant to this section to a qualified applicant. License
20 plates issued pursuant to this section shall not be transferable to any other person except
21 that any registered co-owner of the motor vehicle may operate the motor vehicle for the
22 duration of the year licensed in the event of the death of the qualified person.
