New summary as follows: This bill enacts the provisions of the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act, which makes electronic transactions as enforceable as traditional paper transactions if the parties agree to transact electronically, as long as certain procedural requirements are met. The bill allows electronic transactions and electronic signatures to be legally binding for contracts in courts. For public or private documents that are required to be retained, electronic records could be retained in lieu of paper records, unless specifically prohibited by law. The bill still requires manual execution of certain documents, including wills, codicils, or testamentary trusts, as well as certain other documents as specified by the Uniform Commercial Code.

Also, the bill repeals the current Missouri Digital Signatures Act contained in Sections 28.600 through 28.678, RSMo.
