

House Resolution No. 301

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives always welcome the opportunity to recognize young men who have excelled during their association with the Boy Scouts of America program with its emphasis on physical, mental, and spiritual growth; self-reliance; personal values; service to others; and an appreciation and understanding of the wonderful natural world; and

Whereas, Joseph Robert (Joey) Audsley of Troop 400 in Warrensburg, Missouri, successfully completed all of the stringent requirements for Scouting's highest advancement award, the rank of Eagle Scout, which will be bestowed upon him during an Eagle Court of Honor at Northside Christian Church on February 9, 2003; and

Whereas, attainment of the Eagle Scout rank is dependent upon the sequential completion of each of the Boy Scout steps of Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class, Star, and Life, and expected troop service, a requirement admirably fulfilled by Joey through the billets of Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader, Assistant Patrol Leader, Quartermaster, and Scribe; and

Whereas, diligent labors by Joey earned him numerous Cub Scout awards and such Boy Scout honors as thirty-six Merit Badges; the World Conservation Award; a Coup of the Long Trail; and Firebuilder status in the Tribe of Mic-O-Say, where he is known as Fiery Eyed Chipmunk; and

Whereas, in keeping with Boy Scout practice, Joey applied the knowledge which he learned at troop meetings during activities at seven Bartle Scout Reservation sessions; an OKPIK Winter Camp at Ely, Minnesota; and a Canadian Boundary Waters canoe trip from Bissett, Manitoba; and

Whereas, Joey planned and carried out a required Eagle Service Project which consisted of installing a horse trough, pump, and hitching post to depict the late 1800s landscape of the historic "Old Court House" in Warrensburg;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-second General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the outstanding achievements realized by Joey Audsley during his ten-year-long sojourn with Scouting and to congratulate him for having the drive and energy necessary to attain the rank of Eagle; and

Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for new Eagle Scout Joseph Robert Audsley, son of Rob and Sharon Audsley of Warrensburg, Missouri.
