

House Resolution No. 912

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives hold in high esteem those Show-Me State residents who have admirably committed themselves to a life of public safety through their employment and leadership as law enforcement officers; and

Whereas, Gary McKinney of Joplin, Missouri, has earned considerable distinction as a Traffic Officer with the Joplin Police Department; and

Whereas, on Valentine's Day, February 14, 2003, Traffic Officer Gary McKinney demonstrated his heartfelt devotion to the residents of Joplin when he became engaged in a shootout in downtown Joplin with a gunman who was attempting to resist arrest; and

Whereas, Traffic Officer Gary McKinney pulled over Paul E. Cox at Ninth and Main streets in Joplin as the suspect in a hit-and-run accident which occurred a few minutes earlier on C Street; and

Whereas, the thirty-seven-year-old driver of the suspect vehicle was wanted on an arrest warrant which had been issued one week earlier for a parole violation; and

Whereas, instead of surrendering peaceably, Paul Cox fired two shots at Traffic Officer Gary McKinney using a .44-caliber magnum revolver that had been stolen in a residential burglary earlier in the week in nearby Carthage; and

Whereas, after an unsuccessful attempt to steal another vehicle to make his getaway, Paul Cox returned on foot to where Traffic Officer Gary McKinney had been joined by a Sergeant and a third policeman; and

Whereas, in the ensuing fire, Traffic Officer Gary McKinney and his colleagues fired thirty-seven rounds from their .40-caliber pistols and a rifle to strike the criminal eight times, including a fatal shot which ended the altercation with no injuries to civilians or officers:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-second General Assembly, join unanimously to salute Traffic Officer Gary McKinney of the Joplin Police Department and to convey to him this legislative body's most heartfelt commendation of his selfless actions on Friday, February 14, 2003, when he bravely placed himself in the line of fire in order to protect the citizens of the Joplin community; and

Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution in honor of Traffic Officer Gary McKinney of the Joplin Police Department.
