

House Resolution No. 3132

Whereas, it is with tremendous respect and admiration that the members of the Missouri House of Representatives pause in their diverse daily activities in order to acknowledge a milestone event in the history of the King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry; and

Whereas, strategically located on the parking lot of the Petro station in Kingdom City, King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry will dedicate a new chapel facility on Sunday, June 1, 2003; and

Whereas, King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry is now housed in a forty-eight-foot trailer which has been converted into a worship chapel as part of a nationwide Christian organization which operates from fifty-eight locations in twenty-five states to serve the spiritual needs of the trucking industry and its many employees who travel this country's highways to transport items for commerce and materials for industry; and

Whereas, King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry was established five years ago when a group of truckers and volunteers began meeting for worship and education in the television room of the Petro station; and

Whereas, since February 2003 King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry has provided nightly services at 7:00 and a Sunday morning service at 9:00 for all of those transitory truckers who are in the area and can stop in; and

Whereas, the new King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry facilities have come into timely existence thanks in large measure to the labor and funds contributed by several Callaway County area churches and individuals for donation to the not-for-profit service organization; and

Whereas, King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry works under the umbrella organization of Truckstop Ministries, Incorporated, which was founded in 1981 in Atlanta, Georgia, with a Board of Directors made up of Christians working in the trucking industry:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-second General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the significant commitment of time and energy evidenced in the loving labors of King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry volunteers and supporters and to convey to all of those involved this legislative body's heartiest congratulations and best wishes as they dedicate their new chapel facility on the parking lot of the Petro station at the intersection of Highway 54 and Interstate 70 on Sunday, June 1, 2003; and

Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution in honor of the King's Chapel Truckstop Ministry in Kingdom City, Missouri.
