**Whereas**, Peggy Martin prepared for her coaching career and expanded her skills, knowledge, and experience by diligently applying herself to studies to complete a Bachelor of Science degree from Indiana University, a Master of Science degree from the University of North Carolina-Greensboro, and a Doctorate of Physical Education from Indiana University; and

**Whereas**, it is fitting and proper that the Missouri House of Representatives recognize Peggy Martin for the glory she has brought upon herself and this great state through her successful pursuit of excellence:
