Whereas, Floyd Kimbrough was born to Otis and Carrie (Dozier) Kimbrough on October 5, 1932, and was living in St. Louis, Missouri, on March 24, 2004, when God took him home to the love and beauty of His everlasting light; and

Whereas, Floyd Kimbrough will be greatly missed by his grieving family whose members include one daughter and son-in-law, Nina and Keith McNeely; one son, Daryl Kimbrough and his fiancée, Sharonda; his twin brother, Lloyd Kimbrough and his wife, Brenda Fraison; another brother and his wife, Howard and Izetta Jackson of Oakland, California; three nieces, Regina, Kim, and Renee; his special friend, Juanita Roberson; and a host of other family members and friends; and

Whereas, Floyd Kimbrough will be remembered as a person of unbounded vision who zealously supported many significant endeavors throughout his life:
