Whereas, it is with special pleasure that the members of the Missouri House of Representatives pause to recognize an outstanding group of young Missouri citizens who have distinguished themselves as leaders of their peers; and

Whereas, the members of Girl Scout Troop 1934 in Gladstone, Missouri, are to be commended for their efforts in raising \$900 for Tsunami Relief; and

Whereas, Senior Girl Scout Troop 1934 conducted a Tsunami Relief Donation Campaign at both their Winnetonka High School in North Kansas City and their Girl Scout Service Unit; and

Whereas, during the two week collection period, the girls made posters, decorated and delivered collection jars, and sent email and announcement communications to the main school office to be sent out to students and staff; and

Whereas, at the end of the two week donation campaign, more than fifty jars were collected and tallied separately to determine the top three classes which gave the most money; and

Whereas, Senior Girl Scout Troop 1934 proudly sent a check for nearly \$900 to the American Red Cross in the hopes of making a difference in the lives of those affected by the deadly tsunami that devastated much of Southeast Asia on December 26, 2004:
