

## House Resolution No. 4740

**Whereas**, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives always welcome the opportunity to recognize young men who have excelled during their association with the Boy Scouts of America program with its emphasis on physical, mental, and spiritual growth; self-reliance; personal values; service to others; and an appreciation and understanding of the wonderful natural world; and

**Whereas**, Bradley Kulifay of Troop 826 has successfully completed all of the stringent requirements for Scouting's highest advancement award, the rank of Eagle Scout, which will be bestowed upon him during an Eagle Court of Honor on Saturday, January 8, 2005, at Kennerly Elementary School; and

**Whereas**, attainment of the Eagle Scout rank is dependent upon the sequential completion of each of the Boy Scout steps of Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class, Star, and Life, and expected troop service, a requirement admirably fulfilled by Bradley through the billets of Chaplain Aide, Troop Guide, Den Chief, Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, and Order of the Arrow Representative; and

**Whereas**, diligent labors by Bradley earned him Beyond Brotherhood status in the Order of the Arrow, three Mile Swim patches, a Bronze Palm, and twenty-six merit badges which are arrayed on his uniform sash as a visual illustration of the diverse skills and knowledge which he has acquired as a Boy Scout; and

**Whereas**, in keeping with Scouting practice, Bradley applied the knowledge which he learned at troop meetings in many camping, hiking, and service activities, including four summer camps at S-F Ranch, one summer camp at Swift Explorer Base, spring and fall Camporees, and fall Order of the Arrow Reunions; and

**Whereas**, Bradley completed an Eagle Project which consisted of planning, organizing, and directing the building of three bat houses for Saint Louis County Parks at Bee Tree to serve as a capstone to his Scouting career and to stand as a constant reminder of his dedication to serving others, an admirable trait which justifies the esteemed role which Scouting plays in today's society:

**Now, therefore, be it resolved** that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-second General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the outstanding achievements realized by Bradley Kulifay during his eleven-year-long sojourn with Scouting and to congratulate him for having the drive and energy necessary to attain the rank of Eagle; and

**Be it further resolved** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for new Eagle Scout Bradley Kulifay, son of David and Colleen Kulifay of Saint Louis, Missouri.
