

House Resolution No.

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives always welcome the opportunity to recognize young men who have excelled during their association with the Boy Scouts of America program with its emphasis on physical, mental, and spiritual growth; self-reliance; personal values; service to others; and an appreciation and understanding of the wonderful natural world; and

Whereas, Mitchell Logan Myers of Troop 216 has successfully completed all of the stringent requirements for Scouting's highest advancement award, the rank of Eagle Scout, which will be bestowed upon him during an Eagle Court of Honor on June 24, 2007, at First Lutheran Church; and

Whereas, attainment of the Eagle Scout rank is dependent upon the sequential completion of each of the Boy Scout steps of Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class, Star, and Life, and expected troop service, a requirement admirably fulfilled by Mitchell through the billets of Den Chief, Scribe, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader, Assistant Patrol Leader, Troop Guide, and Mentor to seven recruits and their parents; and

Whereas, diligent labors by Mitchell earned him the God and Country religious award, Junior Leader Training, induction into the Tribe of Mic-O-Say, and fifty-two merit badges that are arrayed on his uniform sash as a visual illustration of the diverse skills and knowledge which he has acquired as a Boy Scout; and

Whereas, in keeping with Scouting practice, Mitchell applied the knowledge that he learned at troop meetings in many camping, hiking, and service activities, including five summer camps at Camp Geiger, four Camporees, and participation in the Adopt A Highway program; and

Whereas, Mitchell completed an Eagle Project that consisted of relocating a 40-foot flag pole and anchor base to property used by the Drug Strike Force and supplying Missouri and United States flags to serve as a capstone to his Scouting career and to stand as a constant reminder of his dedication to serving others, an admirable trait that justifies the esteemed role which Scouting plays in today's society:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-fourth General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the outstanding achievements realized by Mitchell Myers during his nine-year-long sojourn with Scouting and to congratulate him for having the drive and energy necessary to attain the rank of Eagle; and

Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for new Eagle Scout Mitchell Logan Myers, son of Deann Young and Gary Myers of Saint Joseph, Missouri.
