Whereas, the girls got Paige's mother, Mary Korte, to help them call 911 and then find a hidden key to they could unlock the door, enter the house, and comfort Marcella Himmelberg, who had fallen and broken her hip; and

Whereas, Marcella Himmelberg was quite delighted to see the girls because she had failed to attract the attention of her mailman earlier in the day and knew that nobody was expecting to see her until Sunday morning at church; and

Whereas, because of the actions of Caitlin Yung and Paige Korte, Marcella Himmelberg was able to receive help from paramedics far earlier than she would have otherwise:
