

House Resolution No. 176

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives feel it is altogether fitting and proper to pause from time to time to recognize individuals and organizations that have contributed to the welfare of this great state and its citizens, particularly its educators; and

Whereas, Linda Noble, who qualified as a National Board Certified Teacher in November of 2007, Missouri, is completing her eighth year as an educator in Nixa, Missouri, this year; and

Whereas, on Tuesday, February 19, 2008, Linda Noble will enhance an already impressive record of achievements when publicly recognized in the state capital by the Missouri NBPTS Network for National Board Certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards; and

Whereas, Linda Noble received her bachelor of science in education from Dallas Baptist University and her master's degree in 2003; and

Whereas, Linda Noble has served on two Action Teams for CSIP; led several district workshops on Effective Reading Strategies; serves as a valuable source of information and resources for her colleagues; has completed more than thirty post-master's graduate hours; and has presented for Baptist Bible College; and

Whereas, National Board Certification is a lengthy, rigorous assessment that can take up to three years to complete and which results in a less than forty percent success rate for first-time applicants; and

Whereas, to attain National Board Certification, Linda Noble presented evidence of teaching effectiveness, including classroom video segments and analysis of teacher decisions and student work, choice of materials that engage students, checking for understanding throughout the lesson and making adjustments, and properly evaluating student work for understanding to determine what and how to re-teach, and timed assessments to prove superior levels of content knowledge; and

Whereas, part of the evaluative process which Linda Noble underwent to earn National Board Certification included appraisal by a jury of qualified experts in states other than Missouri:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-fourth General Assembly, join to applaud the educational accomplishments garnered by teacher Linda Noble down through the years and to convey this legislative body's heartiest congratulations upon the completion of rigorous National Board Certification through the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and our best wishes for continued success; and

Be it further resolved that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for Linda Noble.
