

House Resolution No. 1277

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives take tremendous pleasure in acknowledging milestone events in the lives of Show-Me State young women who have admirably dedicated themselves to exceptional participation in the Girl Scouts of America program with its emphasis on maturation and growth as a person, citizen, and leader; and

Whereas, Caroline Pelton of Girl Scout Troop 183 has earned the highest achievement award in Girl Scouting, the Gold Award, which will be presented to her during an awards ceremony on March 29, 2008, at the First Baptist Church of Raytown in Raytown, Missouri; and

Whereas, officially designated in 1980 as the highest award in Girl Scouting, the Gold Award is attained by only about five thousand Girl Scouts annually; and

Whereas, Caroline Pelton fulfilled all of the diverse requirements for her Gold Award, including the Gold Award Project, which consisted of planning and implementing an extensive landscaping project for Miralbie School, which included beautifying the entryway by planting flowers, putting up a school sign and handicapped signs, and painting curbs; and

Whereas, in her twelve years in scouting, Caroline Pelton has earned the thirty-one patches and the Silver Award and demonstrated all the skills and attributes required to hold the office of Daisey Leader and Brownie Leader; and

Whereas, Caroline Pelton's other scouting activities include planning and executing over-night sleep-overs for Daisies through Brownies; collecting shoes for Orphans Soul which were given to the Rotary Club for distribution; and she plans to travel with other scouts to Australia and New Zealand for ten days this summer; and

Whereas, Caroline Pelton has earned a Leadership Pin, Career Exploration Pin, and Cadette and Senior Leadership Pins while achieving her From Dreams to Reality Award:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-fourth General Assembly, salute Girl Scout Caroline Pelton and convey to her this legislative body's heartiest congratulations upon completing the stringent requirements for a Girl Scout Gold Award and our best wishes for continued success and achievement in life for many, many more years to come; and
