Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives hold in high esteem those Show-Me State youths who admirably demonstrate their true potential as lifelong learners, involved citizens, and future societal leaders through the excellence of their achievements as students; and

Whereas, Gregg Fox of Saint Louis, Missouri, is a junior at Ladue Horton Watkins High School, where he participates in the school's swim and water polo teams; and

Whereas, Gregg Fox recently enhanced his already impressive record of accomplishments when he scored a perfect "36" on the ACT college entrance exam; and

Whereas, seventeen-year-old Gregg Fox was one of only four Missouri students to earn a perfect score out of the more than 20,000 students statewide who took the test in December 2007; and

Whereas, an avid snowboarder, Gregg Fox isn't sure where he wants to go to college, but he is sure that he wants to study engineering; and

Whereas, Gregg Fox is the son of Kate, a part-time French teacher at Ladue High School, and Ken, who is a career counselor at the same school; and

Whereas, Gregg Fox also is the great-grandson of Omer Avery, who served as a state senator in the late 1960s and early 1970s; and

Whereas, Gregg Fox's perfect score on the ACT is all the more remarkable given that he has successfully recovered from a brain tumor that has appeared twice since he was an eighth-grader in 2004 and for which he was treated by Dr. Jeff Leonard at Saint Louis Children's Hospital; and

Whereas, it is fitting and proper that the Missouri House of Representatives should pause in its diverse legislative actions in order to acknowledge milestone events in the lives of such outstanding Missouri students as Gregg Fox, who stands as a true example of courage and achievement in the face of adversity

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninety-fourth General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the personal and academic accomplishments garnered thus far in the life of Gregg Fox and to convey to him this legislative body's most heartfelt congratulations upon attaining a perfect "36" on the ACT test; and
