Whereas, Mo McCullough is being recognized for his incalculable contribution to Missouri chiropractic physicians and patients and his dedication to the Missouri State Chiropractors Association; and

Whereas, Mo McCullough has changed the face of the Chiropractic Profession in Missouri by bringing enthusiasm, intelligence, professionalism, and direction to the Missouri State Chiropractors Association; and

Whereas, Mo McCullough had a material impact on passing legislation that revised the Missouri Chiropractic Physicians Practice Act (2007); legislation that provided for the inclusion of chiropractic patients in Missouri’s health care plans (2004); legislation that led to the inclusion of a chiropractic physician on the Board of the Missouri Department of Health (2002); and legislation that protected chiropractic physician’s reimbursement through proper execution of a lien:
