1 AMEND House Amendment No. ____ to Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for
2 Senate Bill No. 719, Page 2, Line 22 by inserting after all of said line the following:

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4 "Further amend said bill, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting after all of said section and line
5 the following:

6 "302.173. 1. Any applicant for a license, who does not possess a valid license issued
7 pursuant to the laws of this state, another state, or a country which has a reciprocal agreement with
8 the state of Missouri regarding the exchange of licenses pursuant to section 302.172 shall be
9 examined as herein provided. Any person who has failed to renew such person's license on or
10 before the date of its expiration or within six months thereafter must take the complete
11 examination. Any active member of the armed forces, their adult dependents or any active
12 member of the peace corps may apply for a renewal license without examination of any kind,
13 unless otherwise required by sections 302.700 to 302.780, provided the renewal application shows
14 that the previous license had not been suspended or revoked. Any person honorably discharged
15 from the armed forces of the United States who held a valid license prior to being inducted may
16 apply for a renewal license within sixty days after such person's honorable discharge without
17 submitting to any examination of such person's ability to safely operate a motor vehicle over the
18 highways of this state unless otherwise required by sections 302.700 to 302.780, other than the
19 vision test provided in section 302.175, unless the facts set out in the renewal application or
20 record of convictions on the expiring license, or the records of the director show that there is good
21 cause to authorize the director to require the applicant to submit to the complete examination. No
22 applicant for a renewal license shall be required to submit to any examination of his or her ability
23 to safely operate a motor vehicle over the highways of this state unless otherwise required by
24 sections 302.700 to 302.780 or regulations promulgated thereunder, other than a test of the

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1 applicant's ability to understand highway signs regulating, warning or directing traffic and the
2 vision test provided in section 302.175, unless the facts set out in the renewal application or
3 record of convictions on the expiring license, or the records of the director show that there is good
4 cause to authorize the director to require the applicant to submit to the complete examination.
5 The examination shall be made available in each county. Reasonable notice of the time and place
6 of the examination shall be given the applicant by the person or officer designated to conduct it.
7 The complete examination shall include a test of the applicant's natural or corrected vision as
8 prescribed in section 302.175, the applicant's ability to understand highway signs regulating,
9 warning or directing traffic, the applicant's practical knowledge of the traffic laws of this state,
10 and an actual demonstration of ability to exercise due care in the operation of a motor vehicle of
11 the classification for which the license is sought. When an applicant for a license has a license
12 from a state which has requirements for issuance of a license comparable to the Missouri
13 requirements or a license from a country which has a reciprocal agreement with the state of
14 Missouri regarding the exchange of licenses pursuant to section 302.172 and such license has not
15 expired more than six months prior to the date of application for the Missouri license, the director
16 may waive the test of the applicant's practical knowledge of the traffic laws of this state, and the
17 requirement of actual demonstration of ability to exercise due care in the operation of a motor
18 vehicle. If the director has reasonable grounds to believe that an applicant is suffering from some
19 known physical or mental ailment which ordinarily would interfere with the applicant's fitness to
20 operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways, the director may require that the examination
21 include a physical or mental examination by a licensed physician of the applicant's choice, at the
22 applicant's expense, to determine the fact. The director shall prescribe regulations to ensure
23 uniformity in the examinations and in the grading thereof and shall prescribe and furnish all forms
24 to the members of the highway patrol and to other persons authorized to conduct examinations as
25 may be necessary to enable the officer or person to properly conduct the examination. The
26 records of the examination shall be forwarded to the director who shall not issue any license
27 hereunder if in the director's opinion the applicant is not qualified to operate a motor vehicle
28 safely upon the highways of this state.

29 2. Beginning July 1, 2005, when the examiner has reasonable grounds to believe that an
30 individual has committed fraud or deception during the examination process, the license examiner
31 shall immediately forward to the director all information relevant to any fraud or deception,
32 including, but not limited to, a statement of the examiner's grounds for belief that the person
33 committed or attempted to commit fraud or deception in the written, skills, or vision examination.
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35 3. The director of revenue shall delegate the power to conduct the examinations required

1 for a license or permit to any member of the highway patrol or any person employed by the
2 highway patrol. The powers delegated to any examiner may be revoked at any time by the
3 director of revenue upon notice.

4 4. Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections 1 and 3 of this section, the successful
5 completion of a motorcycle rider training course approved pursuant to sections 302.133 to
6 302.137 shall constitute an actual demonstration of the person's ability to exercise due care in the
7 operation of a motorcycle or motortricycle, and no further driving test shall be required to obtain a
8 motorcycle or motortricycle license or endorsement.

9 5. Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections 1 and 3 of this section, the successful
10 completion of a military motorcycle rider training course that meets or exceeds the Motorcycle
11 Safety Foundation curriculum standards by an applicant who is an active member of the U.S.
12 armed forces, shall constitute an actual demonstration of the person's ability to exercise due care
13 in the operation of a motorcycle or motortricycle, and no further driving test shall be required to
14 obtain a motorcycle or motortricycle license or endorsement. The director of revenue is
15 authorized to promulgate rules and regulations for the administration and implementation of this
16 subsection including rules governing the presentment of motorcycle training course completion
17 cards from a military motorcycle rider training course or other documentation showing that the
18 applicant has successfully completed a course in basic motorcycle safety instruction that meets or
19 exceeds curriculum standards established by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation or other national
20 organization whose purpose is to improve the safety of motorcyclists on the nation's streets and
21 highways. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is created
22 under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is
23 subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section
24 and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly
25 pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule
26 are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule
27 proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid and void."; and"; and
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29 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
30 accordingly.
