

HB 891 -- Liquefied Petroleum Gas

This bill prohibits a county building ordinance from conflicting with the laws governing liquefied petroleum gas installations.

Currently, the Department of Agriculture charges \$10 per test to test liquid meters used for the measurement and retail sale of liquefied petroleum gas. The bill, as of January 1, 2014, increases the testing fee to \$40 per meter and allows the department director, as of January 1, 2015, to set the testing fee per meter at a rate to cover the expenses of the testing, except the fee cannot be set at more than \$120 per meter. The Division of Weights and Measures within the department is also authorized to compute the charges for metrology calibrations to the nearest quarter of an hour rather than the nearest hour and set the fee at a rate that will not yield more revenue than is necessary to run the metrology laboratory.
