

SCS SB 735 -- CAMPGROUNDS

This bill requires a campground owner to post in a high traffic area on the campground or distribute to registered guests or visitors of the campground the written policy on campground curfew, alcohol use, tobacco use, and pets.

A campground owner may eject any person from the campground and notify the appropriate local law enforcement authorities of any person who is not a registered guest or visitor of the campground; remains on the campground beyond an agreed-upon departure time and date; defaults in the payment of any lawfully imposed registration or visitor fee or charge; creates a disturbance that denies other people their right to quiet enjoyment of the campground necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, and safety; or violates any federal, state, or local law. A person who remains on the campground after having been asked to leave by a campground owner for any of the specified reasons is guilty of trespass in the first degree and may be removed by the campground owner or a law enforcement officer. A person removed from a campground is entitled to a refund of the unused portion of any prepaid fees, less any amount owed to the owner or deducted for damages. The unused portion of prepaid fees may be prorated at a rate that is based upon the daily rate charged by the campground owner.

These provisions do not apply to any Missouri state park.
