

HB 1352 -- LAW ENFORCEMENT

SPONSOR: Mitten

In addition to information already required to be reported, this bill requires each peace officer that stops a driver of a motor vehicle to collect and report the following information:

- (1) The race or ethnicity, approximate age, and gender of any individual searched;
- (2) The number of drivers stopped for routine traffic enforcement by peace officers, the peace officer making each stop, the date each stop was made, and the agency of the peace officer making each stop;
- (3) Any property seized and a description of the property;
- (4) Any physical resistance from the driver or any passenger the peace officer making the stop encountered;
- (5) If the peace officer making the stop engaged in the use of force against the driver, passenger, or passengers for any reason;
- (6) Any injuries resulting from the stop;
- (7) Any circumstances surrounding the stop that are subject of any investigation and the results of that investigation; and
- (8) Any written citation or oral or written warning issued as a result of the stop.

The bill requires each law enforcement agency to assign an anonymous identification number to each peace officer making traffic stops. The anonymous identification number must be public record and reported to the Criminal Justice Information Services Division within the Missouri State Highway Patrol to correspond with the data collected under these provisions. The names of the peace officers and his or her identification number must not be a public record or disclosed by the law enforcement agency except when required by an order of a court of competent jurisdiction to resolve a claim or defense properly before the court.
