

HB 2066 -- CORPORATE SECURITY ADVISORS

SPONSOR: Hill

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness by a vote of 11 to 0. Voted "Do Pass" by the Select Committee on State and Local Government by a vote of 10 to 0.

This bill requires corporate security advisors to complete written reports detailing actions taken in the performance of their work duties, whenever actions taken rise above the verbalization level. The corporate security advisor must submit the written report to his or her employer, and the contents of submitted reports will be considered public records.

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that this gives corporate security advisors a way to be held accountable. This makes it so they have to report their conduct, and those reports will be subject to the Sunshine Law.

Testifying for the bill were Representative Hill and BJC Healthcare.

OPPONENTS: There was no opposition voiced to the committee.
