#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that agricultural storm water discharges and return flows from irrigated agriculture are exempt from permitting requirements under the Missouri Clean Water Law and should not be considered unlawful unless the discharges have entered the waters of the state and rendered the waters harmful, detrimental, or injurious to public health, safety, or welfare, to industrial or agricultural uses, or to wild animals, birds, fish, or other aquatic life.

Nothing in this bill should be construed to effect, limit, or supersede any law or regulation of concentrated animal feeding operations.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
