FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **City of Kansas City** (CKC) assume this proposal could have a negative fiscal impact on the City in an indeterminate amount if the City loses earning tax revenue from the City employees' family members who work and no longer reside in Kansas City.

Oversight assumes Kansas City's response is speculative and CKC will not incur significant losses related to this proposal. Oversight assumes this change may increase the number of candidates applying for jobs with cities with such residency requirements. Oversight assumes employees working in, but not residing in, the city limits will still be required to pay the earnings tax.

Officials from the **Branson Police Department** assume this proposal will increase employment and hiring opportunities for the Department. The city limits the Department's ability to fund basic police academy students which are the only applications that are received. The Department is unable to employ these applicants without the POST Certifications.

Officials from the Department of Public Safety's Office of the Director, the City of O'Fallon, the City of Springfield, the Phelps County Sheriff's Office, the Springfield Police Department, the St. Joseph Police Department, the St. Louis County Police Department, the Fruitland Area Fire Protection District, the Carroll County 911 Board, , the Little Blue Valley Sewer District, the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District, the Morgan County PWSD #2, the St. Charles County PWSD #2, the Wayne County PWSD #2, the Hermann Area Hospital District and the South River Drainage District each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version, officials at the University of Missouri System, the City of St. Louis, the Jackson County Board of Elections, the Platte County Board of Elections, the St. Louis County Board of Elections, the Kansas City Police Department, the Bevier Fire Protection District, the Dallas County R-I School District, Missouri State University, the University of Central Missouri and the St. Charles Community College each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties, local law enforcement, fire protection districts, ambulance districts, schools, utilities, hospitals and colleges were requested to respond to this proposed
