AN ACT

To amend chapter 590, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the use of bodyworn cameras by law enforcement.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 590, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 590.1060, to read as follows:

590.1060. 1. There is hereby established in the department of public safety the "Task Force on Body-Worn Cameras".

- 2. The task force shall consist of twenty-three members, appointed as follows:
- 4 (1) The director of the department of public safety or his or her designee;
 - (2) Two members of the house of representatives, with one member appointed by the speaker of the house and one member appointed by the minority leader of the house;
- 7 (3) Two members of the senate, with one member appointed by the president pro 8 tempore of the senate and one member appointed by the minority leader of the senate;
 - (4) One member representing the governor's office;
- 10 **(5)** Two members representing the Missouri association of prosecuting 11 attorneys;
 - (6) One member representing the Missouri state public defender system;
- 13 (7) One member representing the Missouri association of criminal defense 14 lawyers;
- 15 (8) One member representing the American Civil Liberties Union of Missouri;
- 16 (9) One member representing the Missouri POST commission;
- 17 (10) One member representing the Missouri police chiefs association;

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

18 (11) Four members who are police chiefs, at least two of whom shall be from local law enforcement agencies that have deployed body-worn cameras;

- (12) One member who is a law enforcement officer;
- 21 (13) One member representing a local government entity responsible for the 22 oversight of law enforcement;
 - (14) One member representing the Missouri sunshine coalition;
- 24 (15) One member representing the news media;
 - (16) One member representing a victims' advocacy group; and
- 26 (17) One member representing the general public.
 - 3. Within thirty days of the task force's creation, the director of the department of public safety or his or her designee shall convene the first meeting of the task force for the purpose of establishing bylaws and electing officers, to include a chair, vice chair, and secretary. Members may be reimbursed for expenses but shall not receive a per diem allowance.
 - 4. The task force shall examine the use of body-worn cameras by law enforcement and may request such information, recordings, and other records from agencies as the task force deems appropriate for it to effectuate this section.
 - 5. The task force shall deliver a report of recommendations to the governor and members of the general assembly no later than December 31, 2022.
 - 6. The provisions of this section shall expire on December 31, 2028.
