12	WHEREAS, many communities in America where lynchings occurred have erected

19	WHEREAS, the Equal Justice Initiative's Historical Marker Project erects narrative

21	locations and that is widely unknown today; and

23	WHEREAS, these markers invite the community in which they are placed to use truth	
24	to hear silenced voices and expose troubled histories; and

26	WHEREAS, the Equal Justice Initiative has documented sixty lynchings that
