Hi my name is Allisha Eckert. I own Furever Home Pet Sitting, Etc. Besides having at least a fourth of my clients maybe considered to have "Pitbull" characteristics, I've worked and volunteered in several rescues and shelters in the last 20 years. Looking back, there have been very few times that I ever feared a dog that might be a "Pitbull" type. Our local city, Chillicothe, MO, is currently looking at removing our breed ban because the citizens have spoke that they believe these laws do not protect the public. There is no record here or in any other cities surrounding that can prove that these bans have increased public safety. In fact if I had to guess, even though we have the ban, there are numerous dogs within the city that may be considered to have "Pitbull" type characteristics. Especially since most of my clients are within city limits and a fourth could be put in our local ban of no "Pitbull" type characteristics allowed. Vicious dog laws are what work. If a city actually enforced these breed bans, then what next? We remove the next breed that has the highest amount of bites. Doesn't make any sense. I encourage you to do what protects citizens. Breed bans actually do opposite. These breeds are hidden until someone gets bit or another animal does. No socialization, vetting or general care can do that to any dog. That what happens when breeds are banned. They go into hiding until they are not. Please consider having cities take responsibility by removing the bans. This will make cities responsible for what really makes their citizens safe.

He ended up staying at an emergency vet for a week with a punctured lung a d several open wounds on his belly. If my dog hadn't spun in circles and had a ton of fur he would have died that day in front of me and my four year old son. I hated pitbulls for several years after that and bought into the hype surrounding them. How they were bloodthirsty, had brains that outgrew their skull and they snapped, had jaws that locked, could snap unprovoked at any time, etc. Until my best friend found a pitbull puppy abandoned in a foreclosed home. That dog was the sweetest baby irregardless of what had been done to her. Then my mom adopted a set of siblings from a local rescue and though protective of her were the sweetest animals. Then I rescued my own. These puppies were no different than any other of my dogs. They wanted love and wanted to give love to everyone and everything. They have their guirks and personalities and make me laugh every day. They look to me to protect them and to be their voice. They have never done anything wrong except pee on my rugs. They live with and love 2 bunnies, 3 rats, 2 hamsters, 3 adult cats, and 3 orphaned kittens. They love each other, love their mom and dad, and their human siblings. Yet if someone comes in from the city they live in they could legally be taken from their home, and the people who love them so very much and could be killed solely based on the fact they have pitbull blood in their veins. That to be is abhorrent. They haven't done anything to deserve it. Discrimination at its finest. Disregard the fact these animals have been tested many many times and have one of the top temperaments of any breed. Bite statistics are not accurate and do not show the full picture. These animals are by far the most abused, neglected, and tortured of all the breeds. A large portion of criminals, gang members, drug dealers, etc own these dogs and train them to be mean and if they aren't mean enough they kill them. These people neglect and torture these animals, take their food away until they are desperate, abuse them until they have no way out and give up all hope, and create monsters. Even then those dogs aren't the ones to blame. Humans across the world are the #1 most dangerous animal and it should be the ones who think hurting a helpless animal is okay that should be held responsible. Not a single breed of dog. I was a volunteer at the Independence, MO animal shelter for 7 years. I watched families torn apart because they couldn't get their dog back because of the breed ban. I've seen the same dog labeled as an acceptable breed by one animal control officer and then labeled as a banned breed by a different animal control officer. I've seen animal control not accept the breed as determined by a veterinarian. I am a member of the Jackson County Animal Welfare Committee, which oversees the Regional Animal Shelter in Independence, MO. I was on the subcommittee that looked into the breed ban in Independence. After doing their due diligence, reviewing the scientific data, and holding a pubic meeting to hear from the residences, the committee recommended that the breed ban in Independence be repealed. The mayor thanked the committee and nothing has been done to repeal the ban. The subcommittee was formed at the request of the mayor of Independence.I am in full support of HB 1588.Sincerely,Cindy Marshall

I understand and appreciate local governments wanting to protect their citizens from vicious dogs. That's responsible and logical. Unfortunately, too many local governments pass vicious dog ordinances, orders, policies, or regulations that are breed-specific, doing so as a knee jerk reaction without regard to the body of knowledge or experience among canine experts, including dog behaviorists and veterinarians. I am a 77-year-old retired chiropractic physician, medical-legal consulting business owner, Marine Corps veteran, and husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather. It's been my pleasure to have dogs in my "family" for most of the years of my life, ranging from a 4-pound Teacup Poodle to a 155-lb Rottweiler, Along with them I've had German Shepherds. Doberman Pinscher-Rottweiler mix, Pit Bull-Boxer mix, Black Lab, Rottweilers, and Shepherd-Husky mix. Many of those breeds would be on the outlaw list of breed-specific ordinances, yet the only dog that has even come close to biting me was the Teacup Poodle and I was probably more at fault for the attempted bite than the pup. My point, while not an expert I have had decades of exposure to and experience with lots of dogs of breeds that are held in contempt by breed-specific ordinances, yet I've known them to show only love and affection to me and all people meeting them. There is no evidence that breed-specific laws make communities safer for people. The focus of efforts to make communities safer should not be on certain breeds, but on the passage and effective enforcement of laws and ordinances that have the best chances to bring about a safe coexistence between people and dogs, such as: leash laws, anti-animal fighting laws, anti-tethering laws, laws that require all owners to control their dogs regardless of breed, dangerous dog laws that are breed-neutral and focus on the behavior of the individual owner and dog, graduated penalties and options for dogs found to be dangerous, and laws that hold dog owners financially accountable for failure to adhere to animal control laws. Such laws as these would affect all vicious dogs without discriminating against and doing harm to dogs of certain breeds and the humans who love them. That's only fair. Such laws effectively protect both the safety of the community and the rights of responsible dog owners. By contrast, breed-specific laws have been proven ineffective throughout the United States and around the world. Breed bans and other breed-specific laws fail to address the underlying cause of dangerous dog issues - irresponsible ownership - and force animal control officers to spend valuable time trying to identify dog breeds, rather than focusing on true animal problems in the community. They also arbitrarily punish law-abiding dog owners simply because of the breed of dog they own. In addition, breed-specific laws commonly force responsible owners to surrender a well-behaved pet to a shelter, where the dog must be cared for or euthanized at taxpayer expense. House Bills 1588 and 1657 recognize these pitfalls and ensures that communities will devote their resources to addressing the real problems of irresponsible owners and dogs that are truly dangerous, regardless of their breed. Not only have dog ownership and exhibition have had a tremendous impact on the Missouri economy, they also promote and encourage responsible dog ownership and breeding. In 2019 alone, over 750 AKC dog events were held in the state with over 81,700 dogs from across the United States participating. These events generate significant revenue for local businesses through venue rental, dining, lodging, and many other items. Supporting these bills protects the rights of responsible dog owners and sends the message that they - and other lucrative dog events - are welcome in local Missouri communities. Experts from around the country - including the American Veterinary Medical Association, the American Bar Association, the National Canine Research Council, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), and many more - have fairly and impartially determined that BSL simply does not work:a. The CDC strongly opposes breed-specific legislation, citing the difficulty in identifying dog breeds and the inaccuracy of dog bite data. The average person cannot accurately identify a pit bull-type dog - even law enforcement and canine experts may have difficulties identifying mixed-breed dogs.b. The American Veterinary Medical Association opposes breed specific legislation as ineffectual and likely to divert attention and resources away from more effective strategies.

Chairman Falkner and Members of the Committee, Kansas City Pet Project, is a 501c3, nonprofit charitable organization operating the Kansas City, Missouri Animal Shelter. We are the contracted agency enforcing the city code of ordinances for animals and caring for all impounded animals in Kansas City. KC Pet Project supports HB1588/HB1657, which continues to give local governments and enforcement agencies like ours the authority to regulate dogs within their jurisdiction, so long as the ordinance or policy is not specific to the breed of dog. We work to increase the number of homeless pets adopted, enhance public safety, and focus on lifesaving programs promoting pet retention. In 2021, KC Pet Project cared for 6,567 dogs (with total intake of 14,593 animals), making it the largest animal shelter in the Greater Kansas City Metro area. As Kansas City's only open-access municipal shelter, we serve the highest population of animals in the area, and we also have the highest adoption rate. KC Pet Project sees first-hand the greatest negative impact that local breed-specific ordinances and policies have on the shelter, animal control, and residents. American Staffordshire Terriers, Staffordshire Bull Terriers, American Pit Bull Terriers, and mixes of all these breeds are the most frequently banned dog in communities in Missouri, but also one of the most popular breeds in the country. As such, in 2021, more than 30% (1,970) of KC Pet Project's annual dog intakes were breeds that are either restricted in Kansas City, where a mandatory spay/neuter law is in effect, or banned in several of the surrounding communities in the greater metro area. The safest way to house and handle dogs in our shelter is to observe the dog's behavior. Once in our shelter, we take a behavior-based approach to assessing which animals are suitable for adoption and which animals should not, responsibly, be placed in the community. All dogs are held to the same behavior standards, regardless of breed or appearance. This approach keeps staff and volunteers safe, and allows our staff to look at each individual animal's behavior from an objective perspective, with successful placements in new homes as our primary goal. For the last 8 years, KC Pet Project has conducted a dog-to-dog playgroup program to facilitate enrichment to the dogs at the shelter. In 2021, an average of 106 dogs participated in canine playgroups every day, with thousands of dog-to-dog interactions occurring annually with more than 6,000 individual dogs each year. The canine playgroup program easily dispels the myth that certain breeds are more dangerous; all dogs interact with a variety of other dogs as well as diverse groups of staff and volunteers daily with few or no incidents. Over the past ten years, our staff and volunteers have interacted with more than 57,000 dogs that have come through our shelter and we find no significant correlation between the way a dog looks and its propensity to be safe in a community. Further, it is incredibly difficult for our staff to define the predominant breed of a mixed breed dog, so it is illogical for our organization to use breed as a factor for safety and policy decisions. Our shelter takes in an exponential number of dogs that are banned breeds because families are moving from a city where their dog is allowed to a city where their dog is banned, and they cannot take

their dog with them. The dog who otherwise had a good home is then in our shelter, expending organizational and tax-payer resources, instead of moving to a new city with his family. This is one of the many reasons why the state of Missouri should step in. Families rely on the state legislature to protect their property interests by preventing local government overreach. Laws that regulate what your personal property can look like is the epitome of government overreach. Additionally, these local breed specific laws have an adverse effect on travel, economic growth, and local development for cities throughout the state of Missouri. Bordering states of Illinois and Oklahoma have enacted laws similar to HB1588/HB1657, along with 21 other states in the nation. HB1588/HB1657 will make interstate travel and relocation easier for families of these neighboring states and for families within the state of Missouri.Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions whatsoever. I am the founder and have been the Director since being licensed in June of 2015. We have taken in over 1,000 dogs - many being pitbulls. While working with so many different breeds in our rescue, I have never witnessed any ACTUAL evidence of the pitbull breed being more dangerous than any other breed. What I have witnessed is that individual dogs have individual risk factors based on their health and their environmental stimuli during their life. Breed-specific laws simply do nothing to add protection for the public. Pit bull type dogs kill more people than ALL OTHER BREEDS COMBINED, and by a large margin, over 70% of all fatalities caused by canines are from pit bull type dogs. They also kill more other pets than all other breeds combined, responsible for over 90% of all canine caused fatalities to other dogs. When most BSL laws were enacted in the late 80's, there were around 13 fatalities per year, most of which were pit bulls. Now, most years we are seeing human fatalities closer to 50 per year, with that number on the rise. Again, pit bulls top the list, as they have every year for the past few decades. It's not a coincidence. It is not bad owners. It is not that we can't identify a pit bull. It is that pit bulls are simply more dangerous. They attack to kill, driven by gameness, which was bred into them intentionally so that they will fight until they die. Most other dogs were not bred with these traits. It has long been established by courts, that a dog owner of regular intelligence can identify a pit bull type dog. No one argues that you can't identify a pug when you see one, or a Corgi, or a Crocker Spaniel - but somehow they argue that no one knows what a pit bull looks like, and argue that pit bulls aren't committing these attacks, even when the owners of the dogs even say that they are pit bulls. Of all states, 4 of the 5 states with the highest dog bite fatalities have state laws prohibiting municipal level BSL legislation. When communities cannot protect themselves, innocent people suffer. Many people in support of allowing pit bulls are woefully ignorant of pit bulls, how many fatalities they cause, the purpose behind the breed, and its history. In fact, they are convinced they were once nanny dogs that are good with children, despite their propensity to in fact, attack and kill the small humans due to their prey drives and the child being at head level with the dogs.
