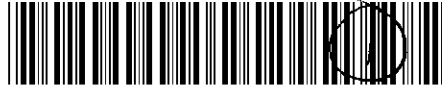

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 1Offered by McKenna of JeffersonAmend SS/HCS/House Bill No. 1106, Page 1, Section A, Line 4

2 of said page, by inserting immediately after all of said line the
3 following:

4 "50.332. [Each county officer] In all counties [except
5 first class counties having a charter form of government] of the
6 first, second, third, and fourth classes, and in any county with
7 a charter form of government and with more than two hundred
8 thousand but fewer than three hundred fifty thousand inhabitants,
9 each county officer may, subject to the approval of the governing
10 body of the county, contract with the governing body of any
11 municipality located within such county, either in whole or in
12 part, to perform the same type of duties for such municipality as
13 such county officer is performing for the county. Any
14 compensation paid by a municipality for services rendered
15 pursuant to this section shall be paid directly to the county, or
16 county officer, or both, as provided in the provisions of the
17 contract, and any compensation allowed any county officer under
18 any such contract may be retained by such officer in addition to
19 all other compensation provided by law."; and

20 Further amend said bill, page 2, section 52.010, line 4 of
21 said page, by inserting immediately after all of said line the

2 "52.320. 1. The collector of revenue in counties using
3 data processing systems of record keeping, except counties of the
4 first class having a charter form of government, in addition to
5 other duties provided by law, shall coordinate the purification
6 of the tax data flows from the offices of the recorder, county
7 clerk and assessor with that of the collector of revenue in
8 cooperation with the data processing center handling such
9 records.

10 2. In all counties of the first class not having a charter
11 form of government and in any county with a charter form of
12 government and with more than two hundred thousand but fewer than
13 three hundred fifty thousand inhabitants the collector of revenue
14 may enter into a contract with a city providing for the
15 collection of municipal taxes by the collector. Any compensation
16 paid by a city for services rendered pursuant to this section
17 shall be paid directly to the county, or collector, or both, as
18 provided in the contract, and all compensation, not to exceed
19 three thousand dollars annually from all such contracts, allowed
20 the collector under any such contract may be retained by the
21 collector in addition to all other compensation provided by
22 law."; and

23 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
