| 32 | commission, by an operator, when so ordered and verified by any court having jurisdiction over         |

| 34 | violation committed in a commercial motor vehicle as defined in section 302.700 or a violation         |

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| 2  | subsection 1 of this section or pursuant to subsection 3 of this section. A court using a centralized     |
| 3  | violation bureau established under section 476.385 may elect to have the bureau order and verify          |
| 4  | completion of a driver-improvement program or motorcycle-rider training course as prescribed by           |
| 5  | order of the court. For the purposes of this subsection, the driver-improvement program shall             |
| 6  | meet or exceed the standards of the National Safety Council's eight-hour "Defensive Driving               |
| 7  | Course" or, in the case of a violation which occurred during the operation of a motorcycle, the           |
| 8  | program shall meet the standards established by the state highways and transportation commission          |

| 13 | provisions of this subsection shall, within fifteen days after completion of the driver-improvement       |
| 14 | program or motorcycle-rider training course by an operator, forward a record of the completion to         |
| 15 | the director, all other provisions of the law to the contrary notwithstanding. The director shall         |
| 16 | establish procedures for record keeping and the administration of this subsection.                        |
| 17 | 304.890. As used in sections 304.890 to 304.894, the following terms shall mean:                          |
| 18 | (1) "Active emergency", any incident occurring on a highway, as the term "highway" is                     |
| 19 | defined in section 302.010, that requires emergency services from any emergency responder;                |
| 20 | (2) "Active emergency zone", any area upon or around any highway, which is visibly                        |
| 21 | marked by emergency responders performing work for the purpose of emergency response, and                 |
| 22 | where an active emergency, or incident removal, is temporarily occurring. This area includes the          |
| 23 | lanes of highway leading up to an active emergency or incident removal, beginning within three            |
| 24 | hundred feet of visual sighting of:   |
| 25 | (a) Appropriate signs or traffic control devices posted or placed by emergency responders;                |
| 26 | <u>or</u>   |
| 27 | (b) An emergency vehicle displaying active emergency lights or signals;                                   |
| 28 | (3) "Emergency responder", any law enforcement officer, paid or volunteer firefighter,                    |
| 29 | first responder, emergency medical worker, tow truck operator, or other emergency personnel               |
| 30 | responding to an emergency on a highway.  |
| 31 | 304.892. 1. Upon the first conviction, finding of guilt, or plea of guilty by any person for              |
| 32 | a moving violation, as the term "moving violation" is defined in section 302.010, or any offense          |
| 33 | listed in section 302.302, other than a violation described in subsection 2 of this section, when the     |
| 34 | violation or offense occurs within an active emergency zone, the court shall assess a fine of thirty-     |
| 35 | five dollars in addition to any other fine authorized by law. Upon a second or subsequent                 |

| 11 | 3. The driver of a motor vehicle may not overtake or pass another motor vehicle within an             |
| 12 | active emergency zone. Violation of this subsection is a class C misdemeanor.                         |

| 14 | assessment of court costs or the assessment of points under section 302.302.                          |
| 15 | 304.894. 1. A person commits the offense of endangerment of an emergency responder                    |
| 16 | for any of the following offenses when the offense occurs within an active emergency zone:            |
| 17 | (1) Exceeding the posted speed limit by fifteen miles per hour or more;                               |
| 18 | (2) Passing in violation of subsection 3 of section 304.892;  |
| 19 | (3) Failure to stop for an active emergency zone flagman or emergency responder, or                   |
| 20 | failure to obey traffic control devices erected, or personnel posted, in the active emergency zone    |
| 21 | for purposes of controlling the flow of motor vehicles through the zone;                              |
| 22 | (4) Driving through or around an active emergency zone via any lane not clearly                       |
| 23 | designated for motorists to control the flow of traffic through or around the active emergency        |

| 25 | (5) Physically assaulting, attempting to assault, or threatening to assault an emergency              |
| 26 | responder with a motor vehicle or other instrument;   |

| 28 | erected to control the flow of traffic to protect emergency responders and motorists unless the       |
| 29 | action was necessary to avoid an obstacle, an emergency, or to protect the health and safety of an    |

| thousand dollars, and four points shall be assessed to the operator's license pursuant to section   |
| 302.302.  |
| 3. A person commits the offense of aggravated endangerment of an emergency responder  |
| upon a finding of guilt or a plea of guilty for any offense under subsection 1 of this section when   |
| such offense results in the injury or death of an emergency responder. Upon a finding of guilt or a   |
| plea of guilty for committing the offense of aggravated endangerment of an emergency responder,   |
| in addition to any other penalty authorized by law, the court shall assess a fine of not more than  |
| five thousand dollars if the offense resulted in injury to an emergency responder, and ten thousand   |
| dollars if the offense resulted in the death of an emergency responder. In addition, twelve points  |
| shall be assessed to the operator's license pursuant to section 302.302.  |
| 4. Except for the offense established under subdivision (6) of subsection 1 of this section,  |
| no person shall be deemed to have committed the offense of endangerment of an emergency   |
| responder except when the act or omission constituting the offense occurred when one or more  |
| emergency responders were responding to an active emergency.  |
| 5. No person shall be cited for, or found guilty of, endangerment of an emergency   |
| responder or aggravated endangerment of an emergency responder, for any act or omission   |
| otherwise constituting an offense under subsection 1 of this section, if such act or omission   |
| resulted in whole or in part from mechanical failure of the person's vehicle, or from the negligence  |
| of another person or emergency responder."; and   |
