FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor (GOV)** state that the current database that tracks appointments to state boards and commissions was developed in 2009. It is a basic internal system that tracks appointments for the current administration. The GOV would have the demographic information requested in the bill available, but only for appointments made by the current administration. To update the system to provide a permanent tracking system of appointments from all prior and future administrations would require an unknown amount, not to exceed \$100,000.

Oversight assumes once this proposal goes into effect, only future appointees would need to have their information retained. Since the current Governor already collects this data, there would be no cost to the state.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
