FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions, and Professional Registration, Department of Health and Senior Services, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Missouri Department of Conservation, Missouri Department of Transportation and Barton County Memorial Hospital** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol** defer to the Missouri Department of Transportation for response regarding the potential fiscal impact of this proposal on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** state the DMH does not perform these types of procedures; therefore, there is no fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** state MHD currently covers these types of injections and, providers are required to work within their scope of practice. Therefore, there would be no fiscal impact to MHD.

The proposal may impact small business health care providers that offered certain kinds of injections for pain if physicians were not the persons giving those injections.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
