JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri an amendment repealing section 8 of article IX of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to education.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next

- 2 following the first Monday in November, 2012, or at a special election to be called by the
- 3 governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for
- 4 adoption or rejection, the following amendment to article IX of the Constitution of the state of
- 5 Missouri:

Section A. Section 8, article IX, Constitution of Missouri, is repealed and one new section adopted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 8, to read as follows:

Section 8. Neither the general assembly, nor any county, city, town, township, school

- 2 district or other municipal corporation[, shall ever make an appropriation or pay from any public
- 3 fund whatever, anything in aid of any religious creed, church or sectarian purpose, or to help to
- 4 support or sustain any private or public school, academy, seminary, college, university, or other
- 5 institution of learning controlled by any religious creed, church or sectarian denomination
- 6 whatever; nor shall any grant or donation of personal property or real estate ever be made by the
- 7 state, or any county, city, town, or other municipal corporation, for any religious creed, church,
- 8 or sectarian purpose whatever may deny to any individual or entity the general state benefits
- 9 of any education program, funding, or other support on the basis of religious identity or

10 belief, so long as such general state benefits comply with the requirements of the First

11 Amendment to the United States Constitution.
