Bill Summary: This proposal increases, from no later than 15 days to no later than 60 days, after a child’s birth that the father has to file an action to establish paternity prior to an adoption or file with the Putative Father Registry.

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS) - Children's Division** state that although the proposal could extend the filing for termination of parental rights by 45 days, it would likely create no substantial fiscal impact for the department.

Officials from the **DSS - Family Support Division (FSD)** state since FSD's Child Support section does not initiate adoption proceedings, this proposal does not affect FSD's policies and procedures and, therefore, has no fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** and the **Department of Health and Senior Services** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.
