1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 180, Page 1,
2 In the Title, Line 3, by deleting the words "penalties for
3 allowing minors to possess intoxicating liquor, with penalty
4 provisions" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "alcohol,
5 with penalty provisions and an emergency clause"; and
6

7 Further amend said bill, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by
8 inserting after all of said line the following:

9 "311.057. 1. No person, firm, partnership, or corporation
10 licensed under this chapter; public venue; or any person acting
11 as an employee or agent thereof shall sell, offer to sell, or
12 serve free of charge any form of powdered alcohol.

13 2. For the purposes of this section, "powdered alcohol"
14 shall mean alcohol that is prepared in a powdered, crystalline,
15 or capsule form either for direct use or for reconstitution in a
16 nonalcoholic liquid."; and

18 Further amend said bill, Page 2, Section 311.310, Line 36,
19 by inserting after all of said line the following:

20 "577.180. 1. A person commits the offense of illegal
21 possession of powdered alcohol if he or she purchases, possesses,
22 offers for sale or use, uses, or sells powdered alcohol or ships
23 any package or container that contains powdered alcohol into this
24 state.

25 2. Any person who violates the provisions of this section
26 shall be guilty of a class C misdemeanor.

27 3. For the purposes of this section, "powdered alcohol"
28 shall mean alcohol that is prepared in a powdered, crystalline,

1 or capsule form either for direct use or for reconstitution in a
2 nonalcoholic liquid.

3 4. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the
4 following:

5 (1) Any hospital that operates primarily for the purpose of
6 scientific research;

7 (2) Any state institution conducting scientific research;

8 (3) Any college or university conducting scientific
9 research; or

10 (4) Any pharmaceutical company or biotechnology company
11 conducting research.

12 Section B. Because of the need to protect minors from
13 accidental intoxication and alcohol poisoning, this act is deemed
14 necessary for the immediate preservation of public health,
15 welfare, peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an
16 emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and this
17 act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and
18 approval."; and

20 Further amend said title, enacting clause and intersectional
21 references accordingly.
