AN ACT

To amend chapter 1, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to prohibitions on certain policies that infringe on private property rights.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 1, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be
2 known as section 1.370, to read as follows:

3 **1.370. 1. As used in this section, "political subdivision" means any state, county,**
4 **incorporated city, unincorporated city, public local entity, public-private partnership, and**
5 **any other public entity of the state, a county, or city.**

6 **2. Neither the state of Missouri nor any political subdivision shall adopt or**
7 **implement policy recommendations that deliberately or inadvertently infringe or restrict**
8 **private property rights without due process, as may be required by policy**
9 **recommendations originating in, or traceable to Agenda 21, adopted by the United Nations**
10 **in 1992 at its Conference on Environment and Development or any other international law**
11 **or ancillary plan of action that contravenes the Constitution of the United States or the**
12 **Missouri Constitution.**

13 **3. Since the United Nations has accredited and enlisted numerous nongovernmental**
14 **and intergovernmental organizations to assist in the implementation of its policies relative**
15 **to Agenda 21 around the world, the state of Missouri and all political subdivisions are**
16 **prohibited from entering into any agreement with, expending any sum of money for,**
receiving funds from, contracting services from, or giving financial aid to those
nongovernmental and intergovernmental organizations as defined in Agenda 21.
