Bill Summary: This proposal requires a public water system to notify the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Health and Senior Services, and its customers at least 90 days prior to a vote to cease fluoridation.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§ 640.136 - Public Water Fluoridation:

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources (DNR)** and **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Cole County Public Water Supply District #3** state because they do not fluoridate their water, this proposal would have no direct fiscal impact on the water district.

Oversight assumes the additional postage and mailing costs related to this proposal are dependent upon a public water system or public water supply district making a decision to cease fluoridation of its water supply. In the event a decision to cease fluoridation occurs, a notice must be sent to all customers, DNR, and DHSS thirty days prior to any vote on the matter.

Oversight has no way of knowing how many water districts and public water systems would cease fluoridation of its water supply.

For the purpose of the fiscal note, **Oversight** assumes no direct fiscal impact on state government and local water supply districts.

Oversight notes this proposal contains an emergency clause with an effective date upon passage and approval.

Officials from the **Cole County Public Water District #4**, **Franklin County Water District**, and **St. Charles County Public Water Supply District #2** did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.


This proposal contains an emergency clause. This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
