ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS)** state this proposal will have no fiscal impact to the MO HealthNet Division (MHD). The intranasal form of this drug has not been approved by the Federal Drug Administration (FDA), is not rebatable and is not on the drug formulary. Therefore, it would not be covered under MO HealthNet.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration**, the **Office of State Courts Administrator**, the **Office of Administration, General Services Division** and the **Department of Public Safety, Missouri State Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
