FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the local government responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of local government responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Oversight assumes this proposal is intended to raise the pay level of sheriffs and deputies in Pemiscot and Dunklin counties and therefore would have costs to both of those counties. Oversight will reflect costs of less than \$100,000 for this proposal to local political subdivisions.


No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, Missouri law requires every application for a driver's license to provide the applicant's residence and mailing address. This bill allows current or retired county, state, or federal law enforcement officers, parole officers, federal pretrial officers, state and federal judges, or any of the above categories' immediate family members to use the address of the county courthouse in the county of his or her residence as the address on his or her license. If a license holder ceases to qualify for this exemption, he or she must apply to the Department of Revenue for the issuance of a duplicate license that displays his or her actual current residence address within 30 days.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
