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**AN ACT**

To appropriate money for supplemental purposes for the several departments and offices of state government, and for the payment of various claims for refunds, for persons, firms, and corporations, and for other purposes, and to transfer money among certain funds, from the funds designated for the fiscal period ending June 30, 2015.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

There is appropriated out of the State Treasury, chargeable to the fund and for the agency  
2 and purpose designated, for the period ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

Section 14.005. To the Department of Elementary and Secondary  
2 Education  
3 For distributions to the public elementary and secondary schools in this  
4 state, pursuant to Chapters 144, 163, and 164, RSMo, pertaining  
5 to the School District Trust Fund  
6 From School District Trust Fund (0688). . . . . \$3,782,000

Section 14.010. To the Department of Elementary and Secondary  
2 Education  
3 For distributions to the free public schools for early childhood special  
4 education provided that no funds are used to support the  
5 distribution or sharing of any individually identifiable student data  
6 for non-educational purposes, marketing or advertising, as follows:

 6 Sections 29, 30(a), 30(b), and 30(c) of the Missouri Constitution  
 7 From General Revenue Fund (0101). . . . . \$2,130,470

2 For Multimodal Operations fringe benefits  
 3 From Railroad Expense Fund (0659). . . . . \$49,071

Section 14.080. To the Department of Economic Development

- 2 For Missouri supplemental tax increment financing as provided in Section
- 3 99.845, RSMo. This appropriation may be used for the following
- 4 projects: Kansas City Midtown, Independence Santa Fe Trail
- 5 Neighborhood, St. Louis City Convention Hotel, Cupples Station,
- 6 Springfield Jordan Valley Park, Kansas City Bannister Mall

7 Retail/Three Trails Office, St. Louis Lambert Airport Eastern  
 8 Perimeter, Old Post Office in Kansas City, 1200 Main Garage  
 9 Project in Kansas City, Riverside Levee, Branson Landing, Eastern  
 10 Jackson County Bass Pro, Kansas City East Village Project, Joplin  
 11 Disaster Area, and St. Louis Innovation District. The presence of  
 12 a project in this list is not an indication said project is nor shall be  
 13 approved for tax increment financing. A listed project must have  
 14 completed the application process and a certificate of approval  
 15 must have been issued pursuant to Section 99.845 (10), RSMo,  
 16 before a project may be disbursed funds subject to the  
 17 appropriation

 2 chargeable to the General Revenue Fund, to the Missouri  
 3 Supplemental Tax Increment Financing Fund

 2 Mortgage Licensing Fund, to the Division of Finance Fund, for the  
 3 purpose of administering the Residential Mortgage Licensing Law

2 For Military Forces Contract Services  
 3 Expense and Equipment

 4 implement the federal Hazardous Materials Transportation

4 employees identified by Section 105.935, RSMo, will be paid first  
5 with any remaining funds being used to pay overtime to any other

2 For the Division of Senior and Disability Services

3 For the purpose of funding respite care, homemaker chore, personal care,  
4 adult day care, AIDS, children's waiver services, home-delivered  
5 meals, other related services, and program management under the  
6 Medicaid fee-for-service and managed care programs. Provided  
7 that individuals eligible for or receiving nursing home care must  
8 be given the opportunity to have those Medicaid dollars follow  
9 them to the community to the extent necessary to meet their unmet  
10 needs as determined by 19 CSR 30 81.030 and further be allowed  
11 to choose the personal care program option in the community that  
12 best meets the individuals' unmet needs. This includes the  
13 Consumer Directed Medicaid State Plan. And further provided  
14 that individuals eligible for the Medicaid Personal Care Option  
15 must be allowed to choose, from among all the program options,  
16 that option which best meets their unmet needs as determined by  
17 19 CSR 30 81.030; and also be allowed to have their Medicaid  
18 funds follow them to the extent necessary to meet their unmet  
19 needs whichever option they choose. This language does not  
20 create any entitlements not established by statute.

 8       percent of the federal poverty level; four percent on the amount of  
 9       a family’s income which is less than 185 percent on the amount of  
 10      the federal poverty level but greater than 150 percent of the federal  
 11      poverty level; eight percent on the amount of a family’s income  
 12      which is less than 225 percent of the federal poverty level but  
 13      greater than 185 percent of the federal poverty level; fourteen  
 14      percent on the amount of a family’s income which is less than 300  
 15      percent of the federal poverty level but greater than 225 percent of  
 16      the federal poverty level not to exceed five percent of total income.  
 17      Families with an annual income of more than 300 percent of the  
 18      federal poverty level are ineligible for this program
