1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 888, Page 1, In the Title, Line 3, by
2 deleting the words "the protection of citizens' personal information" and inserting in lieu thereof the
3 words "public safety"; and

5 Further amend said bill and page, Section A, Line 3, by inserting after all of said section and line
6 the following:

8 "84.514. The chief of police, with the approval of the board, may appoint a police officer to
9 serve as lieutenant colonel on matters relating to homeland security. Notwithstanding the provisions
10 of section 84.510 to the contrary, such position shall be a new position and in addition to the number
11 of lieutenant colonels authorized under section 84.510. The lieutenant colonel authorized under this
12 section shall be responsible for matters relating to homeland security as determined by the chief and
13 be entitled to the same rank, privileges, and compensation afforded all other lieutenant colonels
14 within the department.

15 302.440. In addition to any other provisions of law, a court may require that any person
16 who is found guilty of a first intoxication-related traffic offense, as defined in section 577.001, and a
17 court shall require that any person who is found guilty of a second or subsequent intoxication-
18 related traffic offense, as defined in section 577.001, shall not operate any motor vehicle unless that
19 vehicle is equipped with a functioning, certified ignition interlock device for a period of not less
20 than six months from the date of reinstatement of the person's driver's license. In addition, any
21 court authorized to grant a limited driving privilege under section 302.309 to any person who is
22 found guilty of a second or subsequent intoxication-related traffic offense shall require the use of an
23 ignition interlock device on all vehicles operated by the person as a required condition of the limited
24 driving privilege, except as provided in section 302.441, and the court may order the person to
25 submit to continuous alcohol monitoring as defined in section 577.023, and beginning January 1,
26 2017, section 577.001. These requirements shall be in addition to any other provisions of this
27 chapter or chapter 577 requiring installation and maintenance of an ignition interlock device. Any
28 person required to use an ignition interlock device shall comply with such requirement subject to the
29 penalties provided by section 577.599.

30 302.441. 1. If a person is required to have an ignition interlock device installed on such
31 person's vehicle, he or she may apply to the court for an employment exemption variance to allow
32 him or her to drive an employer-owned vehicle not equipped with an ignition interlock device for

1 employment purposes only. Such exemption shall not be granted to a person who is self-employed
2 or who wholly or partially owns an entity that owns an employer-owned vehicle, except if the court
3 has ordered the person to submit to continuous alcohol monitoring as defined in section 577.023,
4 and beginning January 1, 2017, section 577.001.

5 2. A person who is granted an employment exemption variance under subsection 1 of this
6 section shall not drive, operate, or be in physical control of an employer-owned vehicle used for
7 transporting children under eighteen years of age or vulnerable persons, as defined in section
8 630.005, or an employer-owned vehicle for personal use, except if the court has ordered the person
9 to submit to continuous alcohol monitoring as defined in section 577.023, and beginning January 1,
10 2017, section 577.001."; and

12 Further amend said bill, Page 3, Section 589.663, Line 36, by inserting after all of said section and
13 line the following:

14 "Section 1. 1. This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Alexandra and Brayden
15 Anderson Electric Shock Drowning Prevention Act".

16 2. Beginning September 15, 2016, and every five years thereafter, the permit issuing entity
17 shall mail to every dock permit holder a notice of the following:

18 (1) All dock permit holders who have electricity on their docks shall have, at a minimum, a
19 proper electrical grounding and bonding system pursuant to the National Electrical Code NFPA 70
20 Art. 250, and a functioning shoreline to dock ground fault circuit interrupter; and

21 (2) Dock permit holders shall be liable for injury or death caused as a result of electrical
22 current originating from their dock.

23 3. Nothing in this section shall give rise to any liability on the part of the dock permitting
24 entity.

25 4. The provisions of this section shall apply to any lake having at least one thousand miles of
26 shoreline and owned and maintained by an electrical corporation."; and

28 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
29 accordingly.

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
