1 AMEND House Bill No. 1828, Page 8, Section 571.075, Lines 167 to 180, by deleting all of said  
2 lines and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 "4. Any person who has been convicted of a violent felony as defined in subsection 3 of this section  
5 and who has been deprived of his or her civil right to ship, transport, possess, or receive a firearm as  
6 a result of such conviction may file an application in the circuit court of the county in which he or  
7 she was convicted or in the county in which he or she resides to restore such person's civil right to  
8 ship, transport, possess, or receive a firearm. The court may grant the relief sought if the applicant  
9 has been discharged from confinement, probation, or parole, whichever occurred later, the  
10 conviction occurred five or more years before the filing of the application, the person has not been  
11 convicted at any other time for a felony under the laws of this state or of a crime under the laws of  
12 any state or of the United States which, if committed within this state, would be a felony, and the  
13 court determines that the applicant will not be likely to act in a manner dangerous to the public  
14 safety and that the granting of relief is not contrary to the public interest. If the application is  
15 denied, the person shall not file another application until three years have elapsed without the  
16 permission of the court. If the application is granted, the applicant's civil right to ship, transport,  
17 possess, or receive a firearm shall be restored and the court's order shall so provide."; and

19 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
20 accordingly.
