33 the opinion of such director, such patients would benefit from medical cannabis."; and

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21 Further amend said bill, Page 46, Section 195.982, Line 8, by deleting all of said line and inserting

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24 "that a medical director has certified that such patient is receiving hospice care, has obtained

26 cannabis to the medical cannabis program under"; and
