14 whom the hospice medical director has recommended the medical use of cannabis.

15 (3) A hospice medical director shall not:

16 (a) Accept, solicit, or offer any form of pecuniary remuneration from or to a primary  
17 caregiver, distributor, or any other provider of medical cannabis;

18 (b) Offer a discount or any other thing of value to a registered patient who uses or agrees to  
19 use a particular primary caregiver, distributor, or other provider of medical cannabis to procure  
20 medical cannabis; or

21 (c) Holds an economic interest in an enterprise that provides or distributes medical cannabis  
22 if the hospice medical director certifies a registered patient for participation in the medical cannabis  
23 program.

24 (4) A hospice medical director shall, upon the death of the registered patient, dispose of any  
25 medical cannabis according to hospice protocols.
