FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight notes this proposal creates a Missouri State Juvenile Justice Advisory Board to provide consultation and recommendations regarding best practices within the juvenile justice system. The members of the Board are to meet at least four times a year. The Board is to provide a written annual report of recommendations and activities conducted. Oversight assumes the creation and distribution of the report can be handled within the existing resources of the Office of the State Courts Administrator. Should there be significant costs the Office of the State Courts Administrator can seek additional resources through the appropriation process.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Office of Prosecution Services** and the **Office of State Public Defenders** each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective agencies.

Officials at the **Boone County Sheriff's Department**, the **Cole County Sheriff's Department**, the **Jefferson City Police Department** and the **Springfield Police Department** each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials from the Buchanan County Sheriff's Department, Cass County Sheriff Department, Clark County Sheriff's Department, Columbia Police Department, Independence Police Department, Jackson County Sheriff Department, Platte County Sheriff's Department, St. Charles Police Department, St. Joseph Police Department, St. Louis County Police Department and the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
