AN ACT

To repeal sections 454.849 and 454.1728, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the uniform interstate family support act, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 454.849 and 454.1728, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 454.849 and 454.1728, to read as follows:

454.849. The repeal of sections 454.850 to 454.999 shall become effective upon the [United States filing its instrument of ratification of The Hague Convention on the International Recovery of Child Support and Other Forms of Family Maintenance, adopted at The Hague Conference on Private International Law on November 23, 2007] **effective date of this section.**

454.1728. Sections 454.1500 to 454.1728 shall become effective upon the [United States filing its instrument of ratification of The Hague Convention on the International Recovery of Child Support and Other Forms of Family Maintenance, adopted at The Hague Conference on Private International Law on November 23, 2007] **effective date of this section.**

Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to prevent any loss of federal funding for the child support enforcement program, the repeal and reenactment of sections 454.849 and 454.1728 of section A of this act are deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace, and safety, and are hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and the repeal and reenactment of sections 454.849 and 454.1728 of section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
