

HB 2116 -- HUMAN SEX TRAFFICKING TASK FORCE

SPONSOR: Walton Gray

This bill establishes the Task Force on Alternative Confinement for Victims of Human Sex Trafficking within the Department of Public Safety to develop a statewide plan for alternative confinement programs for individuals less than 18 years who are arrested for prostitution and would be considered, under federal law, to be victims of human sex trafficking. The plan must include, but is not limited to, the establishment and funding of safe houses, alcohol and drug rehabilitation, job training and placement, and public-private partnerships. The task force must meet at least quarterly and submit its recommendations and statewide plan to the Governor, General Assembly, and the department director by December 31, 2017.

The provisions of the bill will expire May 31, 2018.

This bill is similar to HB 266 (2013).
