FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Governor (GOV)** state section 376.2060 creates the State Innovation Waiver Task Force, which is attached to the Office of the Governor for administrative purposes. The Task Force will be comprised of 12 members, including one gubernatorial appointee – a Healthcare Transformation Coordinator. Because of the timing of the proposal – the task force must complete its work by mid-September and is abolished 12/31/2017, it is assumed that the coordinator will likely be an existing state employee or volunteer. The requirement in subsection 2, subdivision (5), related to expense reimbursement for the task for members, could have a minimal impact on the GOV, as the 4 private sector appointees and Coordinator may require reimbursement.

Oversight assumes a minimal impact incurred by the GOV could be absorbed within current funding levels.

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume the House can cover the expenses of the Speaker while serving on the task force.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration**, the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, the **Department of Social Services**, **MO HealthNet Division** and **Division of Legal Services**, the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** and the **Missouri Senate** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.
